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Overall, the body of the article is between 6000 and 7000 words, excluding abstracts and bibliographies. Writing systematics consists of introduction, method, results, discussion, and conclusion. The introduction contains reasons to conduct research supported by a (theoretical) literature review. The introduction is written about 20% of the body of the article. Then, the method contains a brief description of the research method used (about 10% of the body of the article). The next part is very important, namely about the results



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and discussion. This section is written about 65% of the overall content of the article and the discussion of the research results should refer to the results of previous research. The conclusion is written briefly (about 5% of the body of the article) to state a brief answer to the research problem.

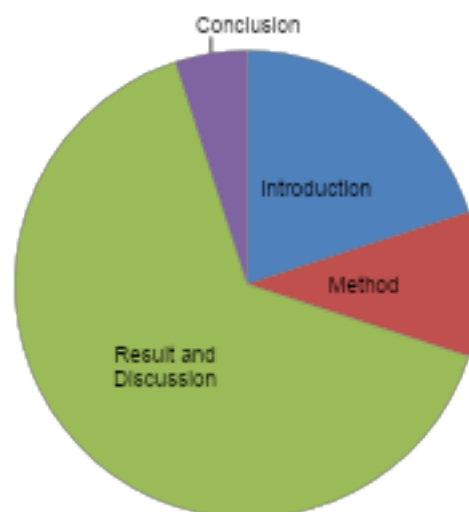


Chart 1. Weight of written parts
