PRINCIPAL'S REPORT - October 2020

Goal 1: Ensure the future of our Catholic Community in North Otago by building a lifetime foundation in the Catholic faith, growing Catholic leaders and promoting a Christ-centred community.

Our Welcome Mass has now been rescheduled for Saturday 14 November at 5pm mass.

I have engaged with families around fees and put in 8 applications to the Nano Nagle fund for support.

I have distributed promotional material for our intermediate department with local Year 1-6 schools and also with local real estate agents. I have written and given promotional material to all year 6 parents.

I attended the Dunedin Diocese Principal's Retreat.

Goal 2: All students have meaningful and engaging learning experiences, striving for excellent outcomes for all.

Our curriculum is very pressed in term 4. We have a senior production, a junior production, Life Education, Athletics and EOTC which is taking up the main focus.

The juniors caught up on their missed swimming lessons at the end of term 3.
