Matt Gaetz

- Withdrew yesterday
 - Announces Pam Bondi as AG nominee - Former AG of Florida
- He was on the Hill on Wednesday with Vance, taking meetings with Senators
 - Caught leaving the meetings by the press and had a pretty positive tone about the meetings.
- The ethics committee voted not to release the Gaetz report.

- Reports are four Republican senators were opposed to Gaetz and not budging

- Introduction to the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE).
 - DOGE's purpose: Cut federal bureaucracy, reduce waste, and return power to Congress and the people.
 - Unique approach: Led by private-sector volunteers, not federal employees, ensuring an outside perspective.

Why DOGE, and Why Now?

- Federal bureaucracy is bloated and unaccountable, posing an existential threat to the republic.
 - DOGE's approach:
 - **Action, not reports** – Focus on cutting costs and regulations, not symbolic gestures.
 - **Three key missions:**
 1. Regulatory rescissions.
 2. Administrative reductions.
 3. Cost savings for taxpayers.

Legal Foundations for Reform

- Supreme Court rulings empowering DOGE:
 - **West Virginia v. EPA (2022)**: Agencies can't regulate without explicit congressional authorization.

- **Loper Bright v. Raimondo (2024)**: Ends Chevron doctrine; courts no longer defer to agency interpretations.
 - Plan:
 - Audit federal regulations.
 - Identify overreach and unauthorized rules.
 - Use executive orders to pause enforcement and start rescission.
 - Addressing criticism: Executive orders to undo unauthorized regulations restore constitutional lawmaking—not executive overreach.

Restructuring the Federal Workforce

- Fewer regulations = fewer employees needed to enforce them.
 - DOGE's workforce reduction strategy:
 - Audit agencies to determine constitutionally necessary staffing.
 - Offer early retirement and severance for displaced workers to ensure respectful transitions.
 - Relocate federal jobs outside D.C. and enforce in-office attendance to encourage voluntary resignations.
 - Civil-service reform:
 - Use "reductions in force" provisions in law to cut staff.
 - President has authority to rewrite civil-service rules to streamline staffing.

Addressing Federal Spending and Waste

- Federal spending waste: Over \$500 billion annually on unauthorized or misused expenditures.
- Key targets:
 - Federal overspending, and federal expenditures that are unauthorized by Congress or being used in ways that Congress never intended
 - \$535 million a year to the Corporation for Public Broadcasting

- \$1.5 billion for grants to international organizations to nearly
 - \$300 million to progressive groups like Planned Parenthood.
 - Auditing outdated federal contracts for potential savings.
 - Addressing the Pentagon's repeated audit failures.
 - Goal: Immediate cost reductions through pinpoint executive actions.
 - Counterpoint to critics:
 - Entitlement programs like Medicare aren't the only path to savings.
 - Focus on fraud, waste, and abuse to reduce the deficit.

The Vision for July 4, 2026

- DOGE's ultimate goal: Eliminate itself by Independence Day 2026.
 - Deliver a federal government that is lean, efficient, and Constitution-focused.
 - A historic opportunity to give the nation the Founders' vision of governance.
- Anticipated resistance:
 - Expect opposition from entrenched Washington interests.
 - DOGE is prepared with a Supreme Court majority, electoral mandate, and constitutional grounding.

- **Nuclear Threats:** Russia has lowered its threshold for nuclear weapon use, which has raised international concerns. This move is seen by some as an escalation, especially in light of the ongoing conflict with Ukraine.
- **International Reactions:** There has been a mixed response globally. For instance, Germany has accused Russia of cutting Baltic cables, adding to the tensions

between NATO countries and Russia. Meanwhile, the U.S. has taken precautionary measures by temporarily closing its embassy in Kyiv due to expected significant air attacks.

Other Concerns

- Russia building nuclear bunkers
 - [Russia](#) has begun mass production of mobile bomb shelters named "KUB-M" that protect against radiation and shockwaves, according to the emergency ministry's research institute.
 - The "KUB-M" shelter accommodates 54 people and can be customized with additional modules, as stated by the institute.
 - The shelter offers 48 hours of protection against various threats, characterized as "a crucial advancement in civilian protection measures" by its developers.
