Hello hard-working teachers!

Our annual Family Math Night will be ______ from __pm. Each grade level will get one table in the Multipurpose Room. As a grade level, we are asking you to set up 2-3 games on your table. To make prep as minimal as possible, we suggest using games you currently have out/are using in your classroom, that way you only need to carry them over after school on the day of the event.

We'd also like to bring the learning our students have been doing out of the classroom, and into our MPR! We can do this by bringing posters from our classrooms that relate to concepts students will use to play the games at your grade level's table. For example, if your grade level will have games about multiplication, you might bring a multiplication strategy poster you created together in class. You could also bring samples of student work using these strategies!

We want to encourage students to be invested in this fun night! We will do this by having "Student Math Ambassadors." Here's how it works: Consider asking your students to sign-up for a time to represent your grade's table. They will get a badge to wear during their time "on duty." While "on duty" they will be available to answer questions and explain how to play the game to anyone who comes to your grade's table. You might ask students to sign-up for 10-15 minute periods.

To recap:

On the afternoon of the event, you need to:

- Bring the games you'll be using to the MPR after school and place them on your grade level's table (there will be signs).
- Bring math posters from your classroom to hang near your table.
- Consider attending the event itself--the students will really like seeing you there!
