As the world bears witness to Israel's <u>explicit</u> actions towards <u>mass ethnic cleansing</u> and <u>genocide</u> of the Palestinian people, presidents of Ivy League institutions call for the mourning of Israeli lives lost, while referencing the Palestinians killed as an afterthought at best or not at all. We, alumni of conscience, are appalled by this hypocrisy in the official stances taken by our universities.

We mourn the exorbitant loss of lives and remain acutely aware of how little regard the institutions we come from have for the Palestinians killed by Israel. Since October 7, Israel has targeted <u>universities</u> and <u>schools</u>, <u>hospitals</u>, and <u>homes</u> to <u>kill thousands</u> of innocent Palestinians, <u>bombing</u> even those attempting to escape.

And, while mourning all of the lives lost, we do not deny a historical context of oppression and murder of Palestinian people. The ongoing retaliative violence and <u>collective punishment</u> are the latest in a long history of Israel's unjust and <u>illegal apartheid regime</u>. Palestinians have been forced into a <u>slow death</u> through murder and <u>blockade</u> in what is the <u>world's largest open-air prison</u>, <u>killing hundreds</u> of civilians each year for over 70 years.

Closer to home, we are disturbed to watch our alma maters allow harm upon their own community members who spoke out about this humanitarian crisis. These courageous students and faculty, who should be defended by their institutions, are instead being <u>abandoned</u>. They are systematically targeted, <u>harassed</u>, <u>doxxed</u>, and <u>threatened with death</u> – by staff themselves in <u>some instances</u>— for expressing solidarity with Palestinians. Under no other circumstance would it be acceptable to blacklist, <u>rescind job offers</u>, <u>commit not to hire</u>, and both harm and allow harm to students receiving threats of violence. This passive acceptance of aggression towards predominantly minority students on their very own campuses is nothing short of shameful.

As <u>some professors</u> outside of our institutions pointed out, the silence from university administrations is calculated and contributes to the very narratives enabling <u>genocide</u>. We are appalled at this deliberate erasure and censorship from institutions that tout intellectual openness.

In a moment when the oppressed are blamed for existing and speakers of truth are punished, we stand firmly with you—students who are fighting for justice and speaking up for the humanity of Palestinians. You follow in the footsteps of giants before you in the fight for liberation. And to those <u>professors</u> in our institutions and <u>elsewhere</u> with the courage to risk your livelihoods in pursuit of intellectually honest scholarship, your work gives us hope in the fight for justice.

A free Palestine is within our reach. As alumni and fellow community members, we stand together to uplift student activism. With privileges of life and voice of which so many are deprived today, let us keep our heads high as we continue to shed light where oppression has grown in darkness. History is on our side.

As the Birzeit union of <u>Palestinian</u> educators reminds us, "we have to use our words, however futile they may feel in such critical times."
