Level 3 – FIS TD - Updated upon completion of the FIS Part B Exam

Serve as Level 2 for a minimum of 2 years, including assignments as TD, TDA, or Jury Member for at least 6 competition days, including at least one Mass Start and Individual Sprint. 3. Recommended as an outstanding candidate by the US SKI & SNOWBOARD Regional Coordinators and the FIS National TD Coordinator. 4. Follow the process outlined in the Rules for the Organization, Education, and Nomination of FIS Cross Country Officials, with a minimum assignment of 6 competition days over the evaluation period. One of the Part A assessments must be from an assignment as a jury member at a multi-day, Championship event.	1. Attend a FIS seminar every two years. 2. Complete Season Update each year 3. Accept two or more TD assignments each season. 4. Available to provide service to the cross-county officials community; present at seminars, organise seminars, serve as Chief of Competition, serve on a committee or working group.
Fast Track - Candidates who have current experience as a coach or team leader at national level events (USA Nationals, Junior Nationals, and or SuperTour), or who are a Chief of Competition at national level events, may be considered for fast-tracked advancement to become a Level 3 Candidate. Eligible candidates are still required to pass the Level 1 written exam.
