Our schools and District believe that clubs have an important place in students' lives. Besides extending and reinforcing the instructional program, these activity groups can give students practice in democratic self-government, provide social and recreational activities, and enhance school spirit and students' sense of belonging. Clubs operate in one of two ways in our schools: (1) as school supported extracurricular activities (authorized under <u>Board Policy 6145</u>) or (2) as student-initiated clubs that are recognized by the school but do not receive any school funding (authorized under <u>Board Policy 6145.5</u>). Clubs listed with * are authorized under <u>Board Policy 6145.5</u>.
