Sourcing / filtering criteria

Relevant content is filtered using the criteria below based on the theme established for each monthly issue of the COVID-19 Monitor. Content is included for coding and analysis if it meets two of the following three criteria:

Criteria	Definition
Global South / Low-Middle Income Countries (subject or author)	Either the author or the subject addresses a region or country in the Global South or low and middle income countries
Accountability relationships or actions	<p>The author / organization / or substance of the content seems to be addressing an accountability relationship or action related to democracy or governance.</p> <p>Relationships refer to actors demanding accountability (i.e., civil society watchdog group or government independent audit agencies) and/or actors being held to account (i.e., elected officials, government officials, public service providers).</p> <p>Actions refer to behaviors related to demanding or delivering accountability (i.e., community score cards, civic advocacy campaign, investigative journalism, publishing public contracting data, etc.)</p>
Philanthropy role or practice (global or non-US)	The author or substance of the content addresses the (actual or proposed) role or practice of global development funders. Role refers to responsibility or leadership positioning of funders. Practice refers to how funders deliver support.

Content is coded and analyzed in Dedoose based on the following codes:

Geographic area	Country	Geographic area covered.
	Global	Coverage of an issue(s) in one country

	Regional	Coverage of an issue(s) in two or more countries in the same geographic region
Populations		Sub-populations of people based on demographics, gender, or other identity
Power	<p>People power</p> <p>Network power</p> <p>Narrative power</p>	<p>Individual, institutional, or collective force or capacity to control or influence change. (Child codes and definitions from Innovation Network Power of Social Movements work.)</p> <p>Power to build, mobilize, and sustain a grassroots base and large-scale public support</p> <p>Power with network of organizational allies that work toward a shared movement vision and goal</p> <p>Power to transform and hold public narratives and limit the influence of opposing narratives</p>
Research	<p>Hypothesis / question</p> <p>Finding / insight</p> <p>Recommendation</p>	<p>Requests for proposals or other planned future or completed research or analysis</p> <p>Hypotheses or learning questions addressed by the research or analysis (whether planned or completed)</p> <p>Finding, learning insight, or conclusion derived from research or analysis</p> <p>Recommended action in response to finding / insight</p>
