- 2. What were you comfortable with? More comfy with the textbox icon, finding other tools was confusing. Having to scroll down to images that displayed text icons.

- 3. Was there anything that needed to be further explained in more detail? Margins and columns section could be clarified. Having pictures and accompanying images closer together
