# Reading and Viewing

- <u>Independent reading:</u> students choose and read a variety of texts on their own or with a partner

- <u>Read aloud:</u> the teacher reads to the class to introduce a particular genre of writing, and for enjoyment and discussion
- <u>Guided reading & conferences:</u> the teacher meets with students to focus on a specific reading skill/strategy, or to assess reading fluency, accuracy and comprehension.

# Writing and Other Ways of Representing

Each day students have opportunities to use writing for a variety of purposes (i.e., journalling). The purpose of spelling instruction (making words) is to explore patterns and develop strategies.
