

New Student Report format from The NSW Department of Education

Following consultation with a range of stakeholders, NSW schools now have a new report format. It still contains the general comment as this was something a few of our members were concerned about, but it is more structured for teachers although it may still need tweaking a bit. We'll send out a survey early next term to get your feedback.

High Potential and Gifted Opportunities at our school

We are currently putting together a set of school procedures to describe what we offer in this area. We have already sent a brief table out to the community on school bytes. When this is complete, I will share this with the school community. Currently due to the time required for core learning and the number of physical spaces we have available before school, during breaks and after school, we are thinking carefully about where to go next. This won't be something we will rush to as I'll need to consult with all staff and current providers.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)



We complete this return each year so as to maximise the support money we receive in schools to support our students with support needs. We classify the needs from differentiating in the classroom right through to a students who need a full-time school learning support officer and/or specialised equipment. What are my school's obligations under the legislation?

The Disability Standards for Education 2005 (the Standards) require that all Australian schools:

- ensure that students with disability are able to access and participate in education on the same basis as students without disability
- make or provide 'reasonable adjustments' for students where necessary to enable their access and participation
- provide reasonable adjustments in consultation with the student and/or their associates; for most students, this means their parents, guardians or carers.

Treasurer's report

We had an issue with our Accounts this month which has required considerable time form our Treasurer to resolve. Our Accounts were frozen as of 28 May 2025, as when we went to the bank in March 2024, we presented minutes to remove historic members of the P&C from the accounts. Unfortunately the bank failed to update the organisation account which is linked to the ACC. A previous president who was still on the accounts failed to act on notices that were sent to him, so this resulted in our accounts being closed. This meant that Square was disconnected from our bank accounts. Accounts have now been reactivated as of 9 June.

Uniform Shop - BF

New prices for select uniform items took effect from Monday 26 May this means our inventory are now all offered at sustainable prices.

Skort samples have been sought from our uniform suppliers. We are awaiting a sample from supplier, PSW, but have received three samples form LW Reid (our current skort supplier). The three skort samples and their wholesale prices are listed below:

- o Lee A-line Sport Skirt Short \$14.50 (inc gst)
- o Perry Sport Skort \$18.25 (inc gst)
- o Stretch Microfibre Skort \$24.95 (inc gst)

Our current skort is \$21 wholesale and retails for \$23.

Suggest eliminating Lee A-line Sport Skirt Short as it has no pockets.

Suggest that in addition to P&C feedback, that feedback is sought from a sample of skort-wearing students to ascertain preferences.
