


### **January 1, 2023**

Students and families should monitor attendance regularly by logging into Infinite Campus.

Туре	<b>Explanation</b>
Excused Absence	Students are allotted 10 days of excused absences per school year. Any absences beyond the 10 days will be classified as unexcused absences (truancies) unless the absences qualify to be exempt absences.  Once a student accrues 5 days of excused absences, a letter is mailed home as a notification/warning that the student has utilized half of their allotted days. Once a student accrues 10 days of excused absences, a second letter is mailed home notifying the student and family that all future absences will be recorded as unexcused absences (truancies) unless the absences qualify to be exempt absences.  • Parent/Guardian reports absence to the attendance office. These absences do count towards the 10 days of excused absences allotted per school year.  • Examples include, but are not limited to: vacation, medical appointment without a medical note, general illness or injury, and special event (not school-sponsored).
Exempt Absence	<ul> <li>Parent/Guardian reports absence to the attendance office. These absences do not count towards the 10 days of excused absences allotted per school year.</li> <li>Examples include, but are not limited to: school-sponsored activity, field trip, medical appointment with a medical note, and funeral.</li> </ul>
Unexcused Absence (Truancy)	Reasons for an unexcused absence (truancy):  • Parent/Guardian does not report absence to the attendance office in advance.  • The unexcused absence will convert to a truancy in 2 school days if a parent/guardian does not communicate an acceptable reason for the absence.  • If a parent/guardian does communicate an acceptable reason for the absence within 2 school days (and the student has not accrued 10 days of excused absences) the absence will convert to an excused absence.  • Student is 15+ minutes late to/misses 15+ minutes of any class without an approved excuse Students who are truant from school for all or part of 5 or more school days in a given semester are considered to be habitual truants. A habitual truancy letter is mailed home which includes details for a follow up meeting with school personnel.
Tardy Excused	Student arrives after the bell, but within the first 15 minutes of the block, and a parent/guardian reports the tardy to the attendance office with an acceptable reason.
Tardy Unexcused	Student arrives after the bell, but within the first 15 minutes of the block, and a parent/guardian does not report the tardy to the attendance office or a parent/guardian does report the tardy with an unacceptable reason.
Other Information	<ul> <li>To be marked present and on time to Block 1, students must be through the doors of their scheduled class by 7:55am.</li> <li>All students entering the building between 7:55am-3:09pm must enter through the main entrance (S1) and present their student ID to a member of the front office staff before proceeding to class.</li> <li>BC is a closed campus. Students must stay in the building from the time they arrive until dismissal (this includes lunch) unless they have an off-site class (Launch, Youth Options, CEO, SPO, etc.) or have otherwise been excused by a parent/guardian and/or school personnel.</li> <li>Students that do not report to their assigned Lancer Block will be marked truant for Resource.</li> <li>Students that are marked absent to 1 or more blocks cannot participate in any after school activities including but not limited to practices, games, competitions, performances, etc. that day.</li> </ul>

### Senior Privilege Option (SPO)

The <u>Senior Privilege Option (SPO)</u> is an incentive program at Brookfield Central and Brookfield East High Schools intended to reward seniors who have demonstrated personal academic excellence, excellent attendance, and appropriate behavior. The SPO allows approved students to leave the high school campus during a scheduled study period.

This application is an agreement between the student, parent, and Brookfield Central High School regarding SPO. <u>This form</u> must be completed and submitted and students must meet the qualifications before SPO will be granted.

### • Stay Home When Sick

Students with symptoms of infectious diseases, including COVID-19, should stay home and get tested. Novir labs will continue to offer free COVID-19 diagnostic and screening tests at no cost to participants through a Department of Health Services program at Hillside Elementary on specific dates and times during the 2022-23 school year.

Students with a confirmed case of COVID-19 should use the <u>CDC calculator</u> to determine a return to school date, notify the Attendance Office of their absence, and adhere to the CDC's recommended actions. For illnesses other than COVID, students should remain home until they are free of fever, diarrhea, and vomiting for 24 hours, without the use of medication.

### Student IDs

Students are required to have their school IDs daily. A student ID is required to enter the building anytime after 7:55am and all students must enter through our main doors (Door S1) and show their student ID. Students use their IDs to access their lunch account, check out library books, and to gain entry to BC sporting events.



# Have A Book In Your Backpack At All Times.

### The BCHS School Wide Read

### The goal is to build our culture of reading at Brookfield Central.

**Basic Overview:** 40 minutes each week (20 minute blocks) will be devoted for students and staff to read a book of their choice and for them to read at least one book each term.

Students will have <u>access</u> to the BCHS library to select their book of choice. Students also may bring books from home. Students will not have access to their chromebooks, phones or any electronic devices during silent reading time\*.

During 1st Term, English & Math Classes (20 minute Library visits per class) will have assigned time to visit the BC Library to find a book of their choice. Students can to use the <u>BCHS Library Online Book Search</u> to reserve (hold) a book and it will be delivered to your classroom!

The reading time will be school-wide and will take place twice a month in each class. At the start of the block, students and staff will read a paper book\* of their choice for 20 continuous minutes. Students will not have access to the library during silent reading time.

There is no expectation for students to complete a reading log or report. Our goal is for each student (and staff member too!) to read one book of their choice each term.

Improved Reading Comprehension-Greater Enjoyment of Reading-Belief in Self as a Better Reader \*Students with IEPs, 504s, and EL plans can have access to electronic reading devices per their accommodations.
