1. THE MAIN IDEA

2. BIBLICAL PERSPECTIVE

Creation

In the beginning God created heaven and earth. In the Biblical account of creation, the Trinity God says, 'Let us make man in our image' (Genesis 1:26). The Trinity God is himself a community, full of harmony and love- one God, three persons. And people are made by God's image, to reflect his likeness, so men yearn for community, for harmony, for love.

Fall

Since sin has entered the world, everyone has sinned, and everyone is imperfect and selfish. A community is made up of people, and when people are in a state of sin, the community is in a state of absence of love and harmony. When the love and harmony of a community is destroyed by sin, people become selfish and unwilling to get along with others, build relationships and help others. Sin not only distorts the relationship between people, but also the relationship between man and the world, nature and himself. People hurt their communities with words and actions, so communities are full of judgment, bickering, and lies.

Redemption

We are rebels against God, who are trapped in lies and sin, unable to save or free ourselves. But God is a loving and just God, who sent Jesus His only son to save the world and crucify himself for all the people's sins. He paid for our sin and unbelief with his own death.

Renewal

When Jesus redeemed us, one of the important things he accomplished was to restore our community capacity. Not for a community but for a community of people from every tribe, language and nation on earth (Revelation 7:9). Scripture says that we are one body, it is with Christ. (1st Corinthians 12:12) so that we may live, love, serve and even tell his "good news" to our friends and neighbors.
