- **5.8 New School Lunch Program** Families can order beginning on October 18th with the first deliveries on October 28th. It is a "Pay What You Can" model with ordering periods every two weeks. Check out nslunch.ca/
 - Easystreet Catering has to do the deliveries with the volume of orders
 - Lists of who ordered what will be available at the office.
 - Drivers/delivery have their checks finished to bring them into the schools
 - Recyclable containers that will have a specialized recycling system
 - considering the amount of food waste
 - Proxy orders
 - Order extra each day just in case (recommendation from the province)
- **5.9 Pizza Thursdays -** We launched two ordering periods and may try another after the School Lunch Program gets off the ground.
 - Bring to home and school the possibility of doing pizza order days
 - leave it for a few weeks to settle into new lunch program first
