E. Superintendent's Report

• District Goals Update

Dr. Cinotti gave an update on the revised Anti-Bullying Law, ESSER Performance Report, Enrollment in next year's 6th & 9th grades, Kindergarten Registration, New Address Verification Process for all Grades 1-5, 7, 8, 10, 11, & 12, Middle of Year Assessments, and thanked Ms. Kim, Mr. Riaz, Ms. Kleinbard, Ms. Budds, & Dr. Penna for their specific contributions to Wandell's educational program. Lastly, she thanks the entire staff for implementing the new instructional techniques we learned from our instructional coaches, which is commendable.

In Dr. Cinotti's District Goal update, she indicated that this year's district goals are monumental regarding curriculum and instruction and she will be recommending to continue the differentiation and workshop model goals into next year. Lastly, she provided a comprehensive look back on how we got here:

- 1. 2018-19 ESSA Accountability Profile was released & we did not meet targets in student growth in ELA, Math, & special education chronic absenteeism. The way to show growth is to instruct students with a deeper level of learning through the differentiation and the workshop model, using John Hattie's research.
- 2. Feedback from parents and community was that our educational program was stagnant & the same projects/worksheets were being used over the years.
- 3. We had the least amount of instructional minutes in math as compared to neighboring districts
- 4. Curriculum was not updated or used. Teachers used the textbook as a guide to standards for learning
- 5. We had not been monitored by the state (QSAC) in over 9 years, as we earned a waiver for being a high performing district. This waiver has since been eliminated
- 6. Summer curriculum writing was completed in Summer 2019, 2020, & 2021 to be QSAC ready.
- 7. Instructional Coaching was implemented in 2018-19 for ELA, 2019-20 for Math, none for 2020-21 due to COVID, reinstated for 201-22, & will continue for 2022-23.

- 8. A rigorous, common assessment schedule was implemented for 2021-22 and will continue focusing on BOY, MOY, & EOY with iReady as the common assessment tool.
- HIB report- *None at this time.*

Mrs. Hickey gave an update on current and future school programs, events, and activities. Mrs. Hickey thanked Mrs. Kleinbard for her efforts during Read Across America month and with the Gifted & Talented Program. Mrs. Hickey also thanked the Foundation for funding the 5th grade field trip.

Included in budget line 620, Budgeted Withdrawal from Capital Reserve- Excess Costs & Other Capital Projects is \$480,000 for other capital costs related to replacements/upgrades for classroom sinks, bathrooms, server room, and wheelchair lift. The total cost of these projects is \$480,000 which represents expenditures for construction elements or projects that are in addition to the facilities efficiency standards determined by the Commissioner as necessary to achieve the New Jersey student learning standards.
