Indirect Object with For

✔ Common verbs that take *for* (Benefit / Advantage)

- **buy** – I bought a gift *for* her.
- **make** – He made dinner *for* us.
- **cook** – She cooked a meal *for* me.
- **get** – I got a drink *for* you.
- **do** – He did the laundry *for* his mum.
- **build** – They built a treehouse *for* the kids.
- **find** – I found a seat *for* you.
- **leave** – She left a message *for* him.
- **save** – I saved a piece of cake *for* you.
- **fetch** – Could you fetch the papers *for* me?
- **open** – He opened the door *for* her.
- **write** – I wrote a poem *for* you.
- **paint** – He painted a picture *for* his friend.
- **sew** – She sewed a dress *for* her daughter.
- **carry** – Let me carry those bags *for* you.
