

Subject: Constituent disappointment with the vote against the Clarity Act

Dear Senator [Last Name],

I am writing as a constituent of [State] to express my disappointment that the Senate failed to advance the Digital Asset Market Clarity Act on Tuesday.

Cryptocurrency and digital assets will be foundational to our financial system and the global economy within a matter of years. The countries that understand this technology and write workable rules will lead. The United States should be that country.

American firms are already building on blockchain without clear legal guidance. BlackRock, J.P. Morgan, Amazon, Coinbase, Robinhood, and many others are operating in a gray zone. Uncertainty does not freeze innovation. It pushes it offshore, along with the jobs, tax base, and market infrastructure that should stay here.

Voting the bill down did not protect the public. It left the market without a national rulebook: no clear split between the SEC and CFTC, no consistent customer-asset protections, and no durable path for companies that want to operate lawfully in the United States. That looked less like prudence and more like political posturing aimed at one person who stands to benefit if crypto grows. Blocking an entire framework so one official cannot gain, asks the whole country to absorb the cost. The protection and growth of the American people should come before a party or a specific person.

Ethics rules matter. Officials should not write the rules for markets they personally sponsor or promote. Strengthen those provisions. But ethics cannot be a pretext for leaving America with no rules at all. Politicians have long benefited from the industries they oversee. Singling out one administration while the rest of the world writes the standards is not reform.

I want jobs in America. I want growth in America. I want clear rules so this country leads in digital assets instead of watching the work leave. Party fights should not outweigh the interest of the American people.

When I vote, I will look at who was willing to put an American framework on the table and who chose delay. Please explain this vote, say what changes would earn your support, and help bring market-structure legislation back for a real decision.

America should write these rules. Please act like that is still the goal.
