Notes to parents

- Help your children balance screen time with other activities, like playing games, doing a craft, or going for walks.
- Know what your children are accessing online to make sure it is ok for them. You may want to go online with them. Talk about what they are watching and doing.
- Guide your children with digital citizenship with reminders of being safe, respectful, and responsible online just like when they are at school. We've been talking about integrity lately: doing what is right even when no one is looking. It matters online, too.
- Help your children create accounts. For many sites, a person must be at least 13 to create their own account. If an account is required, read through their About, For Parents, and Terms of Service.

 internet is appropriate for elementary students. Here are two free Chrome
 extensions you could add that you may find useful as your children are out on the
 internet...
