MORNING PROCEDURES

Our school opens at 7:15am every morning for student drop-off. Students will eat in the cafeteria and then go to the gym with a teacher until being dismissed to outside recess (weather permitting) at 7:30am. We will close the north gate (6th grade drop-off area) at 7:30 to have a morning recess from 7:30-7:35am. All students will report to 1st hour at 7:35am. The tardy bell rings at 7:45am.

AFTER SCHOOL PROCEDURES

Pick-up begins at 3:00pm. We are the FIRST school to release, so plan to start with us if you pick up at multiple schools. All parents will be given a sign with their child's name at Open House to display in their car windshield. A teacher will come out to the car line at 2:50pm to send names to our Lead Pick-Up Teacher. Once the bell rings at 3:00pm, car kids will come out to the pick-up area. Please make sure your car sign is visible.

**Students that walk home will be released once the car line has cleared for safety reasons (approximately 3:15).

LOCKERS

All students will be issued a locker. Our lockers do not have locks on them. Students have the option to bring their own combination lock or key lock to use on their locker. Students who bring their own lock will need to leave a copy of the combination or key in the office.

Students are not allowed to carry their phones on their person during the school day, so it is suggested that you have a lock for your locker or it can be checked in at the office until 3:OOpm.

CHROMEBOOKS

Every Parker student will use a Chromebook in all of their core and some specials classes as a resource for instruction. Yearly insurance is available for \$25. Families will have to opt—in or opt—out of insurance for the year prior to October 15th.

SCHOOL MEALS

Breakfast and lunch are FREE at Parker! Students can bring their own lunch. Students may purchase additional items for lunch. Money can be loaded onto your child's My School Bucks account or they can bring cash. **Students cannot carry around food (only a water bottle) during the school day unless a 504 with specific accommodations are required. It must be consumed in the cafeteria during the designated time.**

LUNCH CAFETERIA PROCEDURES

Students are not allowed to have fast-food/restaurant food brought to school for lunch. We do allow students that earn Character Club to have fast-food/restaurant food brought to school on their designated day as an incentive for earning Character Club.

WATER BOTTLES

Students will need to bring a refillable water bottle to school each day. We have 1 water fountain that can be used if students forget their water bottle.

- Cell Phones and Smart Watches (even if they are wifi only) are not allowed to be
 worn or carried on a student while at school. If students bring their cell phone or

- Toys are not allowed at school.
- Dress Code:
 - Bare midriff cannot be shown.
 - Shorts and skirts should be at mid-thigh
 - **All dress code violations are up to the discretion of the Principal.*

DRESS CODE

The McAlester Board of Education has established a student dress code to allow students to express themselves while establishing and maintaining a positive, safe and inclusive learning environment for students to engage in education. Generally, dress and grooming standards are determined by the students and their parents will not be questioned. The only requirements the board of education insists upon are that students' dress and grooming shall not lead school officials to reasonably believe that such dress or grooming will materially and substantially disrupt or interfere with a student's education, school activities, or create a health or other hazard to the student's safety or to the safety of others. In accordance with the policy of the board of education, the following regulation shall establish a dress and grooming code for the public school system.

Hats/Headwear: Students shall not wear hats or headwear in the building unless a medical or religious exception exists.

Clothing:

- Shirts may not be sheer or mesh and must cover the entire trunk of the body. Messages on shirts shall
 not include illegal drugs, alcohol, tobacco or other products that may not be utilized by children. Vulgar
 and/or obscene messages are prohibited and will be subject to discipline under the student discipline
 code.
- Pants, shorts, skirts and skorts shall be worn at the waist and must be not shorter than mid-thigh.
- Hats or headwear may be worn on spirit days with the permission of the administration. With the
 exception of religious and medical hats or headwear, other head coverings are prohibited.
- Sunglasses may not be worn in the building unless medically necessary and documented.

WEEKLY ASSIGNMENTS

Every week, teachers will give assignments that are due by Friday unless assigned otherwise. Our goal is for all students to submit their work to stay on track! For students who do not submit their work on time, they may be assigned Academic Detention from 3:00-4:00pm from Monday through Friday. Teachers will send home a note or have the student call home to notify parents that they were unable to complete their assignment and when they will need to stay after school. We want our students to be responsible, practice time management and not fail their classes for missing assignments.

Teachers will give a a copy of their syllabus and expectations at Open House and send on the Parent Square app after school starts.

OPTIONS FOR SPORTS

- Fall Sports—PRACTICE WILL BE DURING SCHOOL unless Coach Mason calls additional practice
 - Girls (Softball & Basketball), Boys (Basketball)
- All students and parents will be required to sign a contract with academic and behavior expectations for their child to participate in basketball. The majority of our games occur during the school day, so if students are behind in their classwork, they will not be allowed to leave class to play in the game.
- Students must maintain a "80 or higher" average in all of their classes to participate in the games. We check grades every Monday to determine their eligibility for the week.
- Behavior and consequences that are given will be factored into a student's participation in athletic practice and games.
- Winter Sports-We are planning to offer wrestling for 5th and 6th grade. Practice will be at 7:00am when season starts.
- Spring Sports-PRACTICE WILL BE DURING SCHOOL unless Coach Mason calls additional practice
 - Girls (Track/Field), Boys (Baseball, Track/Field)
 - Tennis for Boys & Girls (Practice will be after school when season starts)

Same ACADEMIC & BEHAVIOR expectations for FALL AND SPRING SPORTS

5th Grade Classes

- All 5th grade students will be enrolled in Math, Reading, Social Studies, Science and two classes of Special Electives Rotation of (Art, PE, STEAM, Library will rotate each quarter) for the full school year. All students will also have one RTI class the last 30 minutes of the day.
- Students can choose to participate in Athletics for one of their electives. They will be enrolled for the semester if they are participating in the sports that are practicing during school time.
- All 5th grade students will have the opportunity to try out for Band at the end of the year for their upcoming 6th grade year.



6th Grade Classes

- All 6th grade students will be enrolled in Math, Reading, Social Studies, Science and 1 Elective (Band or a rotation of Typing) for the full school year and 1 Rotation of Career Explorations or Athletics.

- All 6th grade students will have the opportunity to choose Band. 6th grade is the only beginning band class offered to McAlester students. <u>Students who choose NOT</u> to take band will not have an opportunity to join at a later time.

• Positive Office Referral

Every week, a teacher will nominate one student that displays the character word of the month. The teacher will fill out the Google Form "Positive Office Referral". The office will call students down individually and make a parent contact. The student will earn 30 minutes in the game room.

Monthly Character Assembly

Teachers will select one student from their grade level and fill out a nomination form. Mrs. Hoover will read the nomination forms at our monthly assembly and have the selected child come to the front to be recognized. Mrs. Hoover will send home a lunch invitation form with each nominated child to invite their parents to school for lunch the following week. Students whose parents are unable to attend can invite a friend to sit with them. We will have a designated area for the Character luncheon. **Character Club students can have lunch brought in on their designated celebration day from local restaurants or fast food.**

AR Goals

We use the Accelerated Reading Program at our school. The program takes the STAR Reading score from a child and gives them a lexile range that helps guide our teachers, librarian, and students to choose books that are challenging yet achievable to increase reading comprehension. Students are also assigned a 12 point Reading Point Goal each 9 weeks of school. After a student reads their book, they take an "AR Test" that asks comprehension questions and gives them points and an accuracy score based on how many questions they answered correctly.

We use AR to monitor reading progress, set individual goals and teach our students how to be responsible and accountable for their learning. For our students that meet their individual AR goal with an 80% average comprehension score from their book tests will earn the following:
