The UN Security Council,

Encourages countries with large populations to take proper responsibility for their abundant emissions,

Acknowledges that smaller nations will require much more assistance in the overall lowering of greenhouse gas emission,

Desires to create and spread proper and effective plans that will assist all countries towards lowering their net emissions as a whole,

Calls attention to the differences of the global states and the different plans they will need to enact to act efficiently and effectively,

Emphasizes the fact that larger countries should take measures in good faith to assist smaller countries in their overall reduction of emission,

- 1. *Urges* larger, developed countries to take greater actions on providing renewable resources;
- 2. *Calls upon* subsidies being given to smaller countries to combat climate change without damaging any involved economies;
 - a. P5 members, developed states, and international organizations that actively
 interact with and benefit less developed states will grant sufficient amounts of
 money to developing countries,

- b. Any country with a GDP above \$40,000 USD--or any NGOs dedicated to environmental causes with a budget of over one million (1,000,000) USD, such as Greenpeace--should be the subject of providing subsidies for smaller countries.
- 3. *Requests* for larger states to dedicate a certain percentage of revenue towards combating climate change and assisting less developed countries;
 - a. The certain percentage in question is five (5) percent of a state's total revenue,
- 4. *Further recommends* for smaller countries to take the necessary steps to reduce climate change within their individual means and capabilities;
 - a. Countries with a GDP beneath \$20,000 USD per capita are considered smaller countries in this specific resolution,
 - b. The necessary steps include the reduction of the production of any greenhouse gasses, oil usage, and any emission-related production until the state in question reaches a net emission rate of fifty (50) percent at minimum.
- 5. *Directs attention* to current infrastructure to transition from oil to solar and other renewable resources.
