Harry J. Beck, 500 Bowen street, served as a storekeeper first class on the destroyer USS Morris in the Pacific. He entered service Nov. 16, 1941.

Henry J. Beck enlisted Nov. 13, 1941, was assigned to a destroyer, and after 23 months of combat duty in the south Pacific and Aleutian islands, was transferred to the Hawaiian islands for duty as a storekeeper disbursing, where he has been stationed approximately 11 months. He has participated in seven major engagements, and has now been sent home on a 30-day leave for rehabilitation, and reassignment to a new ship.

Harry John "Henry" Beck, 69, Oshkosh, died Sunday afternoon in Middleton Veterans Hospital, Madison.
