Many mortuaries REQUIRE you buy their casket to take advantage of their “package price”.

That's why we've calculated the cost of a full service funeral if you were to buy each item individually (itemized) EXCEPT their utility van.

***Our itemization does not include a utility van because we think you can move your own flowers and the mortuary charges elsewhere for running errands and removal of body.**

Our Itemized Package in this survey ONLY includes: the non-declinable fee, transfer of remains, embalming, other prep (which is hair, makeup, dressing, casketing), 1 hr viewing followed immediately by a funeral service (not at mortuary), graveside/committal service, and a funeral coach/hearse). That is meant to standardize the survey and to only choose the minimum most people (without a support system) would buy.

Nor do any of the above packages include: Casket, Obituary, Flowers, Burial clothing, Longer viewing or visitation, Extra certified copies of death certificate, M.E. permit if burying out of state. **Nor Cemetery fees:** plan to add 3K+ for plot, opening/closing, grave marker, vault or grave liner (graveside chairs, awning, fake grass) and any other things not specifically listed.

Discovery: Just like hospitals & insurance companies, mortuaries raise cremation or forwarding prices in order to allow for a discount of what they really want you to buy. That way they don't mind if you choose cremation because they made the price outrageous.

The perceived savings for a "package deal" if you buy THEIR casket is often around the cost of their lowest priced casket (\$1500-2500).

Choosing to itemize (buying only what you really need) can save money and allow you a more intimate experience with your final farewell.

2) PLEASE don't necessarily go to the mortuary closest to your house:

Generally there's no experiential difference based on distance, unless you need to use their facility for viewing and/or [funeral.If](#) over 25-50 miles they'll typically charge \$3/mile.

Direct Cremation Package here includes paperwork, a casket (particle board or cardboard), a box for the ashes (called “temporary container” in the vernacular of the funeral biz), and the actual cremation.

A memorial service *held after* cremation is simplest to arrange without a funeral director.

A funeral service *followed by* a direct cremation can be accomplished easily as well, but requires support of family or friends..

Forwarding of Remains: If you want embalming, this is an economical way to purchase (1) retrieval of the body (2) death certificate (3) burial transit/M.E. permit (4) embalming. Then the Funeral Home can turn the body over to the family to: hold meetings, ceremony & delivery to final resting place on their own.

See how many things families can do themselves:

- -Procuring paperwork,
- -Embalming (FHs insist on this for open casket because how the body looks is their calling card/claim to fame)
- -Body prep (washing, dressing, casketing or other custom)
- -Hearse
- -A van or truck to transport casket
- -Directing people and casket during gathering
- -Obituary (a free death notice can be published)
- -Video or Audio recording of ceremony,
- -Transporting flowers to chapel and graveside
- -Lowering casket into grave (depends on cemetery).
