# Important Information For Early College Applicants and Parents

- 1. To apply to the Early College Program, the student must:
  - be a sophomore enrolled in a Campbell County high school
  - be enrolled in Algebra II/Trig or a higher-level math course and have successfully completed Algebra I and Geometry
  - have a GPA of 3.5 or higher
  - submit a completed application by the designated due date.
- 2, The <u>due date</u> for returning the completed application to your school counselor is **February 14, 2025.**
- 3. See your counselor for other details about the application process.
- 4. All students accepted into the program must participate in an orientation that will be held shortly before the beginning of the school year. Students will be notified of the date as soon as it is set.

Think carefully about the issue presented in the following excerpt and the assignment below.

Every person sees the world through their perspective or point of view. Many factors shape a person's perspective, such as background, education, and social environment. Perspective-taking is the ability to put aside personal perspectives and view the world through another person's point of view. This allows people to better understand how others think and feel, helping to increase empathy and reduce conflict.

Researchers have found evidence that the part of the brain responsible for self-control is also responsible for the ability to understand others' feelings. Behavioral science has found that children develop an early form of self-awareness when they are about eighteen months old and first become self-conscious about their relationships when they are between four and five years old.

Understanding another person's perspective is an important step in learning how to resolve problems, get along with others, and achieve goals.
