Significant Enrollment Changes Since MFP

Choice - Target 56, Current 53

- We lost **three** 6th-grade students, 2 to another choice school, 1 to virtual
- We lost **one** incoming kindergartener to another choice school
- We have lost communication with **four** students (two families); they moved, and we have not been able to track them down (4K, 1st, 4th, 6th)
- We have two other students (3rd, 5th) with parents in a custody battle and have disappeared

Non-Member - Target 13, Current 7

- We lost **two students (**4K, 1st) to public school
- We had **one** 3K student decided to stay home
- We have lost communication with one 3K student

Member - Target 75, Current 74

- We had **one** 5K student decide to go to public school
- We had **one** 3K decide to stay home

Other WELS - Target 18, Current 17

- We had **one** 1st-grade student who decided to go to public school
- We had **two** 3K students stay at home

SNSP - Target 11, Current 10

 We had one 2nd-grade student who would have required a full-time aide to support needs

Financial Impact

\$68,403 Tuition Shortfall vs MFP

- Projected \$1,016,900 vs. Current \$948,497
- 17.5% vs 9.7% increase
