Who we are

The Design guild is a **student-run Graphic Design studio** at the Rhode Island School of Design. We specialize in web, identity and brand, print, typography, and image making, working primarily with organizations at RISD and Brown University. Some of our notable projects include Artist Ball posters, RISD Commencement, New Student Orientation, and the annual RISD Yearbook. Our studio is small and fully run by students who support daily operations, individual projects, and our clients directly. We work together with a team of advisors to support our endeavors, including our hiring cycles. Our advisors are **Sarah Knarr** (Director, Center of Student Involvement), **Minkyoungh Kim** (Assistant Professor, Graphic Design), **Mary Banas** (Senior Visual Designer, RISD Marketing & Communications), and **Nancy Skolos** (Professor and Department Head, Graphic Design). Together, we are committed to creating a transparent and inclusive studio and hiring practice.

The workload on the team is equivalent to another studio class, up to over 8 hours per week. Hours may vary from week to week, including additional time for more demanding projects such as Yearbook and our hiring cycles.

So...you're hiring?

Yes we are! Working under CSI (Center of Student Involvement), we are a unique campus entity offering **paid design services** for the school. As we prepare for incoming projects, we are looking to **expand our current team of 6 students to up to 15 members**. This year, we have openings for the following (maximum positions available by academic year)

Sophomores	2
Juniors (incl. first year grads)	4
Seniors (incl. second year grads)	3

Process and Timeline

Our hiring process will include an **open-call application** as well as an **in-person interview** with shortlisted candidates. Both open-call applications and interviews will be reviewed together by both the Design Guild team and the Advisory team. Our open-call applications begin on September 23 and will be open until October 7.

Before you apply...

- For all applicants, please understand that **hours are not regular and income will not be consistent**. It is hugely dependent on what projects are currently ongoing. This position is an academic year position and does not include the summer.

- Please note that **F-1 visa holding students cannot exceed 20 hours per week** for all on-campus jobs combined while school is in session.

Interview

After open-call applications close, the Design Guild team will review applications together with the Advisory Team. We will be shortlisting up to 4 sophomores, 6 juniors, and 5 senior students for the interview process.
