What is the title of your students' first initiative?

How does this request collaborate with the mission of our Undergraduate Student Government?

I am the Senator for Athletics, this is a new position so I am still trying to navigate the ways and events that I can do to have a voice for this population. I am always asking questions and engaging in conversation with fellow students to see if there are issues I can help with. Being on two other student athlete committees, they take care of the brunt of the problems. I know these are big prizes, but I made sure to look at Director Bunting's allocations report and we still used less than 50% of our SFFR budget and the year is almost over.
