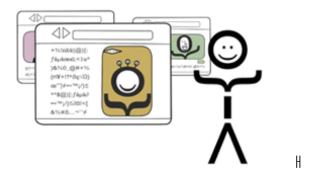

Students understand human, cultural, and societal issues related to technology and practice legal and ethical behavior.

a. Advocate and practice safe, legal, and responsible use of information and technology

I teach this using online discussion platforms.

b. Exhibit a positive attitude toward using technology that supports collaboration, learning, and productivity

-Students blog about what they are learning in the classroom, as part of the unit we discuss how commenting can become a digital 'conversation,' how the work they post online becomes public and so should reflect their best ideas, most thoughtful attention, etc.
