### Subject: Verb Agreement

Subjects and verbs must AGREE with one another in number (singular or plural). Thus, if a subject is singular, its verb must also be singular; if a subject is plural, its verb must also be plural. verbs REMOVE an s from the singular form.

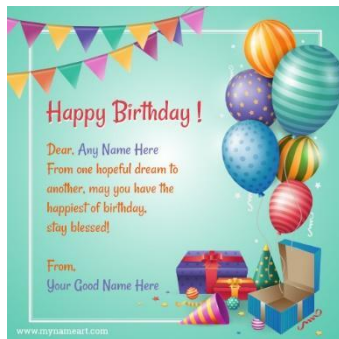
Example: The list of items is/are on the desk.

## Semester 1 Chapter 3

### Subject: Report Text

Report Text is a type of text in English that describes the details of an object. Details in this text are scientific details which include the description of objects, both physical and non-physical, from scientific facts about the object.

Report Text is included in the Descriptive Text which has the purpose of providing information to readers about the object of this text itself. Although Report Text and Description Text are almost the same, they are actually two different texts. Report Text tends

to lead to scientific factual text and is more general than Description Text so that there is no subjective opinion from the author

### Subject: Announcement Text

Definition of Announcement is one of the short functional text. In English verb of announce had a meaning "make a formal public declaration about a fact, occurrence, or intention."
