- Legal waste removal should be easier for Oaklanders (most waste is residential)
- The city should strengthen enforcement (fines are lower, enforcement for residential is greater than commercial, lack of collaboration).
- 311 reporting and action should be more timely and efficient
- Gallo: extra line item bill that goes back to the city: where does the money go?
- DMV registration holds exist for vehicles impacted by citations that are not paid
- Wang: part of the failings of this program have to do with the inaccessibility of the 311 system
- Houston: train enforcement officers on how to collect data to prosecute

RRFB contract award to Bay Area Lightworks

- **\$304,900**

Purchasing Electrical Equipment and Accessories with Graybar Electric Company

- Electrical, lighting, data communications, security products, and related supplies
- Not exceeding \$1,500,000 over five year period
- No bids were received from Oakland vendors, so purchasing had to look further away
- Approved on consent

Illegal dumping Expenditure Plan

- Negotiates grant agreements and contracts not to exceed \$1,100,000, works with Regional and State agencies
- Waives some advertising, competitive bidding, and local/small business requirements
- Appropriates and allocates \$1,100,000 from Fund 1720
- Appropriates additional funds from public and private sources and authorizes City Administrator to seek and apply for new funds
- Directs City Administrator to return within one year to provide an informational report on what happened
- Local orgs would work with multi-unit buildings to organize bulky waste pickups
- SCS and sub3 are consultants on the project
- Gallo commented that the approach won't be as effective as it could be

- Houston comments that we should be deterring people from dumping, not just dumping
- Wang asked “how do we measure success?” various KPIs. Other public comment mentioned that KPIs should be set prior to start.
- Approved on consent

Cantrans Community Cleanup and Employment Grant

- Accept funds (\$300,000) from CalDOT to execute plans
- Waives some advertising, competitive bidding requirements
- Increases Youth Employment Partnership by \$250,000 to not exceed \$2,125,000
- Increases agreement with Lake Merritt Institute by \$50,00 to not exceed \$1,212,500
- Adopts CEQA findings
- Most people in support

- Operation and management of La Salle Garage and Scout Lot on Mountain Blvd for five years and \$295,000/year (not to exceed contract amount of \$1,476,000)
- Waives competitive proposals and other requirements
- Houston asked about whether employees are from Oakland: no changes are being made, not sure where employees are from
- Wang asked about “master fee schedule”, increased costs mainly due to inflation, garage is designed as “value” zone to incentivize parking there

- Gallo asked where funds being generated are being collected: monthly operation reviews occur and operators of reviews make sure funds are deposited directly into Oakland bank accounts
- Public speakers: lots of discussion about transfer of Parking jurisdiction from DOT to Finance
- Motion passes

Caltrans Maintenance agreement amendment for Litter Removal

- Authorizes administrator to Negotiate with Caltrans for maintenance on ramps
- State giving Oakland money to do overtime work
- Houston: which sites will receive treatment? Subset of 29 sites decided based on OakDOT review. Who will be managing cleanups? Caltrans groups and John Hilman (lots of details will be provided)
- Gallo worried that Oakland can't even manage their own jurisdictions, this will seem like added responsibilities
- Wang: does "yes" vote absolve Caltrans of responsibility of these sites? Not exactly, Oakland would have responsibility to clean, but Caltrans could come and clean if needed (or do other maintenance)
- Public speakers: this is crazy, Oakland doesn't have time for this
- Motion passes (Gallo: no)

- CM Houston brought up that Redgwick Construction may not actually be an Oakland business

- Daupler provides voicemail/some dispatch operators for Oak311 calls after hours (outside 8am-7pm)
- 311 hasn't been as responsive; why? Answer: "not sure/unaware"
- Forwarded to full council

Three-Year Maintenance Services Agreement With YES Construction Group, Inc.

- Backflow valve testing, required by EBMUD to enable water service to City buildings
- Only contractor bidding on item is YES
- Forwarded to full council

CFD 2015-1 Gateway Industrial Landscape Maintenance Contract 2025

- Contractor needed at Gateway area because special interest area (city staff can't do it?)
- Landscape maintenance of grounds
- Possible soil contamination complicates topic
- Forwarded to city council

Amending And Expanding The Civicorps Contract Agreement

- Increasing funding to Civic Corps projects, expanding scope of work, giving contracts directly to Civic Corps (waiving additional solicitation of other bidders)
- Forwarded to city council

Maintenance Agreements Between The City And Caltrans

- OakDOT is required to get encroachment agreement from Caltrans when performing work adjacent to CalTrans

- This aims to remove requirement and streamline process
- Forwarded to City Council

Purchase Of Asphalt Paving Materials For In-House Paving And Sidewalk

Operations

- Reduces further advertising and competitive bidding under OMC Section 2.04.050(1)(2), opens bidding to open market
- Allow Transportation Dept to fulfil paving obligations that are already on the books (would not be met otherwise)
- No other asphalt vendor in the area close enough to provide asphalt that is still hot when it arrives in Oakland (Martinez is too far), this vendor has ties to company that has not refuted ICE contracts
- Forwarded to City Council

Ensure Compliance With Sewer Consent Decree

- Waiving requirements for small/local businesses, Looking for bidding to fix combined sewer overflows
- Not enough bids for work in Oakland, estimates are coming in high (part of a larger trend)
