iNaturalist is a free tool that helps people document wildlife, plants, fungi, and other organisms all over the world. People share their observations with each other and scientists. To see the wildlife others have found in your area, follow these steps:

1.	Go to <u>iNaturalist.org</u> . Choose the "Explore" tab at top left.

	How many species have people observed globally?
2.	Type the name of your city, town, or community in the "Location" box and select "Go."

3. Select the "Species" tab, and scroll to see photos of the species found in your area.
