Today marks Chi Hack Night's 250th event and **5 year anniversary**! Yes, we've been doing this for 5 years, and what a ride it's been! For the occasion, we invited our members, alumni and past presenters to share how Chi Hack Night and it's community has affected or benefited them. We were floored by your responses. New Chicago Open Data Portal, Developer Portal, and Sidewalk Cafe Permits

City of Chicago released a <u>redesign of the open data portal</u> (data.cityofchicago.org). The new portal is now mobile friendly; connects visitors with apps, tutorials, and context about new data sets; includes links to city services when appropriate; and features a redesigned search function and dataset landing page. The redesign of the portal incorporated feedback over the past 5 years, in addition to a user testing session at Woodson Regional Library and a session during ChiHackNight.

The city also released a redesigned <u>dev.cityofchicago.org</u>, which now serves as a central site for links to and documentation on city-supported APIs. Besides the data portal, Chicago is supporting an increasing number of APIs to provide greater services and information. The new site also contains a blog focused on developers, providing updates on technical changes, outages and more. The city has retired chicagoportalstatus.tumblr.com as it's been consolidated into the new Dev Blog.

Finally, the city released a new dataset, <u>Sidewalk Cafe Permits</u>. A list of permits for sidewalk cafes -- outdoor restaurant seating on the public way. Businesses may begin sidewalk cafe operations on March 1 and operate through December 1.



Chicago Women Take Action - Activist Mentoring

<u>Chicago Women Take Action</u> (CWTA) is interested in forming a two-way mentoring partnership with Chi Hack Night.

CWTA is made up of women who are progressive leaders in Illinois civic and political institutions and long-time activists. Many are at retirement age and would like to ensure their knowledge of issues and organizing is available to those picking up the mantle of leadership on the left, as well as receive mentoring themselves in engaging in organizing in the tech realm.

We are envisioning one-on-one, two-way mentoring partnerships, centered around shared issue interests, such as gun violence or women's rights. However, we are open to other ideas for structuring a partnership.

NASA SpaceApps Hackathon

From NASA: "Part of NASA's Earth Science Division, SpaceApps has become *the world's largest global hackathon*, engaging thousands of citizens each year across the globe to work with NASA in building innovative solutions challenges we face on Earth and in space using open source data. Diverse and collaborative teams of technologists, scientists, designers, entrepreneurs, and others work together in a 48-hour sprint to develop answers to some of the most pressing challenges facing planet Earth using NASA data. *Over 15,000 citizens from 61 countries and in 161 cities around the world participated in the 2016 International Space Apps Challenge*. April 29th and April 30th 2017 is NASA's SpaceApps Challenge! It's a weekend long "hackathon" for brainstorming solutions to Earth problems, using NASA open data, citizen science, and more. Participants can work alone or in teams, and promising projects will be sent on to NASA for review and potential awards. SpaceApps Challenge Chicago is also looking for volunteers and mentors to help with the event and guide participants with their project ideas during the event.
