Ms. Koyama's Message for the Moment

Late Tuesday evening, it was announced that Colfax is once again on "The List" for school consolidation. We received information that the potential future for Colfax is to turn our ECE-5th grade school into an ECE Center. While the Northwest region could use an ECE center, it is concerning that a two story building was named as a site for this type of service, while any other ECE center in DPS is a one level building. By licensing regulations, students would not be able to use the second floor. It is also concerning that parents did not have input into this proposal for the larger system to make this recommendation for such a center or use of the building.

Tuesday morning we also had twenty people present for a morning Coffee with the Principal. We shared questions and feelings about a potential closure of our current model, and established next steps for making our voices heard at the Board meeting on November 14th. This is an open public comment meeting that takes place before final decisions are made November 17th. More information is below about how you can contribute.

Even though the recommendation is to have Colfax turn into an ECE center, NO DECISION IS FINAL until the School Board vote on November 17th.

Inside our building, this is a challenging time. Our staff knew going into this year that based on the committee that established the criteria for closure/consolidation, there was a potential this current situation would happen. EVEN with that information, we had ONE teacher who CHOSE to leave at the end of last year. This CONSISTENCY in staff demonstrates the COMMITMENT of the individuals who come to school each day to educate our students. Educating students is not a walk in the park, and it's infuriating to me as the building principal to have this additional pressure on a staff to work through personally and professionally as we support students through this process. It's added trauma that may be unnecessary if we can get the Board to **not** vote in favor of the recommended consolidation. Much of our

school community already experiences significant trauma due to gentrification, homelessness, and a myriad of other circumstances, and the next 15 days are going to be another layer of adding to that trauma. Trauma impacts how the brain learns, and as an education system, it's ironic how that same system does this to children and then expects the school to 'make it all ok'.

But I have another concern. I am concerned that not all of our community is aware. I am concerned that people don't see texts, emails, Dojo messages, or read our Tiger Tales that go out each week. PLEASE ask your neighbors and other families you pass on the street to make sure they are aware, and if not, please tell them to come check in with us at the main office to get updated and to get involved. All voices are needed in this process!

And while we work together with our broader community during this uncertain time please contribute in the following ways:

1. Attend our community meeting on November 1st at 5pm.

Some people from DPS will be present at 5pm. Make your concerns known.

2. Attend our CSC meeting on November 3rd at 3:15 pm

This was an already scheduled meeting. We will strategize our approach for the November 14th Public Comment Board meeting.

3. Sign-up for Public Comment November 7th - 10th

This must happen in order to speak on November 14th

4. Attend our next Parent Coffee on November 9th at 8am

This can be a time for even more of our community to come together to continue to strengthen our strategy.

5. Save the date for November 14th for Public Comment at the next School Board Session

Attend as a large community to share the impact the decision will have if we are in fact selected to close.

- Residents, parents/guardians, staff and students who wish to address the Denver Public Schools Board of Education during a public meeting may sign up online, as well as by phone. The form is available on the agenda for public comment. Sign up is available online at 9:00 a.m. the Monday before the scheduled Public Comment & Progress Monitoring meeting. The public comment sign-up form can be found <a href="https://example.com/heres/her
- Similar to phone sign ups, the online sign-up window closes the Thursday before the Public Comment & Progress Monitoring meeting at 5:00 p.m. A finalized list of speakers will be posted to the Public Comment agenda by noon the day of the Public Comment & Progress Monitoring Meeting.

Process for the public comment session:

- Three minutes will be allotted to individual speakers and 10 minutes to groups.
- Individuals may sign up only once to address the Board. NO INDIVIDUAL IN A GROUP WILL BE ALLOWED TO SPEAK FOR MORE THAN THREE MINUTES. Substitutes are not allowed...only the person who signed up to speak may address the Board.
- Anyone without computer access may still sign up by calling 720-423-3210 by 5:00 p.m. the Thursday before the Public Comment & Progress Monitoring meeting.


Savahanna Made
