QUANTUM STATE OF FLUX

Different Stories in Star Trek require different approaches in order to make it a compelling story. There are times however, this creates a contradiction with events established in episodes from other series. Could it be a difference in computing power, general power output, technical skills? Your guess is as good as mine. An example of this is contradiction is when we compare the holographic consultant programs created in the TNG episode "Booby Trap" and the Voyager episode "Nothing Human." In both cases extremely large databases were introduced into a holographic representation of "real" people with personalities. Geordi was able to use voice commands in a relatively simple way to accomplish the goal of creating Dr. Brahms while it took much more effort for Kim to create the Dr. Moset hologram. Did the older and larger Enterprise have more processing power than the smaller and younger Voyager? Perhaps. Would the episode have been the same if simple voice commands were able to create the Medical Consultant program? Probably, but having those technical hurdles added to the danger of the situation and did enhance the general story.
