HUMAN TRAFFICKING

How to Report Trafficking

If you believe you are the victim of a trafficking situation or have information about a potential trafficking situation, contact the <u>National Human Trafficking Hotline</u> (https://humantraffickinghotline.org/en/report-trafficking). Specialists are available 24

hours a day, 7 days a week, every day of the year. Report a tip or request services using the following means:

- Text HELP or INFO to BeFree (233733)
- Report a tip online
- If you or someone you know is in immediate danger, call 911.

 Each state and territory have a victim compensation program to reimburse crime victims for the cost of medical services, mental health counseling, lost wages, and other expenses incurred due to the crime. State statutes govern victim compensation benefits so that eligibility may vary among states.

Contact the compensation program in the state where the crime occurred for more information on eligibility and the application process. To find the appropriate victim compensation program, visit our <u>Help in Your State</u> page and click the state where the crime occurred.

A local victim assistance program may also assist you with filing a victim compensation claim. Contact <u>VictimConnect</u> for a referral in your area.
