The question of whether Jesus is the only way to God is crucial to Christian faith, and contrasts with today's widespread belief that all religions lead to the same truth. Jesus clearly stated, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). This bold claim makes Christianity unique because it does not just offer one possible path to God; it declares that Jesus is the only way.

Unlike pagan religions, which are based on myths and symbolic rituals, Christianity is grounded in historical events the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Scholars affirm that Christianity did not borrow from pagan traditions but instead stands on verifiable facts (Habermas & Licona, 2004). Pagan religions often feature dying and rising gods tied to nature cycles, while Christianity presents Jesus' resurrection as a one-time, historical event with eyewitness testimony (Craig, 2010).

Some argue that saying Jesus is the only way to God is narrow-minded, especially in a world that promotes religious tolerance. However, the truth is exclusive. If Jesus truly rose from the dead, then His claim is not just a personal belief but a reality. The Christian message is not about excluding people but inviting everyone to salvation through Christ (Romans 10:9-10). Christianity stands firm in its claim, not to be boastful or arrogant, but we as Christians understand, it offers the only solution to humanity's need for redemption. The depths humanity has deteriorated to, around the world today, forces us to be even more steadfast in our beliefs. We as a people have wandered so far off the path, a global revival has started, publicly bringing others to Christ, in hopes of swinging the pendulum back in the other direction before we all have a devastating fall, and must be humbled, and then recreated.
