Using 'While' and 'When' with Past Tenses

Both 'while' and 'when' are commonly used to describe actions that happened in the past. However, they have distinct purposes and are paired with different tenses to convey specific meanings.

1. 'While'

Used to describe **two ongoing actions** happening at the same time. Often paired with the **past continuous tense**.

Structure:

- While + [past continuous], [past continuous/simple past].
- OR [past continuous/simple past] + while + [past continuous].

Examples:

- While I was cooking, my friend was setting the table.
- I was reading a book while she was watching TV.
- He called while I was driving.

Key Rule: 'While' emphasizes actions that occurred simultaneously for a period of time.

2. 'When'

Used to describe an **interruption** or a **sequence of events**. Often paired with the **past simple** and **past continuous**.

Structure:

- When + [past simple], [past continuous].
- OR [past continuous] + when + [past simple].

Examples:

• When I arrived, she was cooking.

- I was walking home when it started to rain.
- He was watching TV when the phone rang.
- I woke up, took a shower, ate my breakfast and went to work. -> sequence of events

Key Rule: 'When' often introduces the shorter or interrupting action.

Quick Tip for Remembering:

- Use 'while' for two ongoing actions.
- Use 'when' for an interruption or a sequence of events.
