There are 4 items of interest to follow. 1. The 2023 yearbooks are ready to be distributed. The yearbooks will be being distributed on Monday, October 2nd, during lunches. Students will receive information on how to pick up their purchased books during advisory. Please let your student know that they will need their student ID.

2. Grief & Loss Support Group:

Is your student struggling with the loss of a loved one? Hospice of the Calumet Area is set to begin their in-person Teen Support Group. This new series starts on October 2, 2023, and extends through November 13, 2023. Sessions meet weekly on Mondays from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at their office in Munster. - 3. Reminder, COVID is still a thing. We've had many sick students over the last few weeks and we ask that you monitor them and test them as appropriate. The COVID protocol is attached to this email for your reference.
- 4. Attention All Parents: IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Mark your calendars for **Wednesday, October 11th**.

That is our PSAT testing date for all students in grades 9, 10, and 11.

After testing, students will be released to go home. There are no makeups for this test.

Bus service will run for all regular bus riders to and from school.

All <u>Seniors</u> will have the whole day <u>out of school</u> to perform college visits, post-secondary exploration, preparation, or job shadowing.

<u>Seniors</u> whose morning begins at the ACC are still welcome to attend the ACC that day as we will still run bus service to/from Hammond. There will be **NO ACC** for <u>JUNIORS</u> on this date. This is an excused absence that we coordinate with the Hammond ACC.

Pathfinder students in Grades 9, 10, and 11 are expected to be present in the morning to test. Seniors in Pathfinder will have a day out of school to accomplish the same activities as the remainder of the senior class. There will be no afternoon Pathfinder classes that day.

Lifeskills class will also be on an eLearning day that day.

Testing will take place in your student's ADVISORY classroom for most students. Breakfast will be available in the Cafeteria before school. At 7:30, students will be asked to report to their assigned testing location. We ask that students be ON TIME for testing as the College Board prohibits us from admitting late arrivals. Testing is anticipated to conclude between 11:00 and 11:30.

Students will be provided with a sack lunch on their way out of the building should they choose to take one.

If you are the parent of a student who has a modification or accommodation for testing, they will be notified specifically where to go. <u>Those students who qualify for an extended time will likely require alternate transportation home on this day, please plan accordingly</u>.

The PSAT is designed to help your student:

- Get a feel for what the actual SAT will be like
- Access FREE online practice tools to improve where needed
- Explore careers, colleges, majors, scholarships, and AP class eligibility.
- Enter into recognition programs that can qualify them for scholarships.
- Meet benchmarks that allow them to earn college credit

Students are asked to please bring the following items:

A FULLY CHARGED IPAD

- Pencils and an eraser for scratch work
- The calculator they use for math class
- Snacks for breaks (optional)

Lastly, if a student chooses to bring a phone with them to school on this day, they will be directed to store it safely with their Advisory teacher during testing. Per College Board policy, all electronic devices are prohibited during testing, including during breaks.

Thank you for understanding and supporting our efforts to provide this opportunity to our eligible students.






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STOH Guidelines for Positive Students

- 1. Isolate for 5 days.
- 2. May return to school on day 6.
