For this activity, I chose to investigate OERs that would support students' understanding of alternative economic theories (such as a circular economic model). The following resources are a course text, a case study of an existing business, and a simulation.

- Circular Economy Snapshot: Frogbox (https://core.ac.uk/reader/75761272) CC BY-NC-SA 4.0
  - a. This snapshot is a useful tool for sharing with students how concepts explored in the text and through discussions can be applied in our current economic model.
    It's quick, one-page newsletter-style format increases reading appeal.
- Gapminder: Unveiling the beauty of statistics for a fact based world view (https://www.merlot.org/merlot/viewMaterial.htm?id=1204819; https://www.gapminder.org/data/) CC BY 4.0
  - a. This is a simulation that can help students understand GDP in relation to important global factors such as environmental impact. Gapminder, however, has a variety of comparative data that is presented in a highly interactive way to engage kinesthetic/tactile learners and emphasize key themes discussed in the course.
