



DSWD DROMIC Report #24 on Tropical Storm "BASYANG" (I.N. SANBA)

as of 02 March 2018, 7PM

Situation Overview

On 11 February 2018, 1100H, a Tropical Storm with maximum winds of 55 km/h and gustiness of up to 65 km/h entered the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR). The Tropical Storm, Sanba, was locally named "Basyang".

It dissipated into a Tropical Depression and left the PAR on 16 February 2018, 1100H.

Situational Reports

DREAMB

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
12 February 2018 - present	 The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DReAMB is continuously coordinating and monitoring affected FOs reports related to TS Basyang. DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report on the TD is available online at: http://dromic.dswd.gov.ph. An Emergency Response Preparedness (ERP) meeting was conducted today, 1330H at the NDRRMC Operations Center, which was attended by DReAMB staff.

DSWD-FO MIMAROPA

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
22 February 2018	The DSWD-FO MIMAROPA has submitted their Terminal Report.
15 February 2018	 Evacuation Centers in the municipalities of Araceli, Balabac, Magsaysay, Rizal and Sofronio Espanola were activated to accommodate families who take precautionary measures against flooding, flashflood, and landslide. The Fifteen (15) reported EC were all pre-emptive. Local Government Unit of Araceli has distributed food and water to IDPs. As per coordination with PDRRMO and SWADT Office, all rescue teams on standby were ready to be deployed any time. DSWD-FO MIMAROPA closely coordinated with MDRRMO/MSWDO/PDRRMO to effectively monitor the situation and weather disturbance within the affected areas of Palawan. Reported opened evacuation centers were all used for pre-emptive evacuation. This was undergoing validation by the Field Office as to the number of currently open ECs.
12 February 2018	 Activated Field Office Operations Center to monitor daily local weather condition and provide situational awareness. Alerted all P/C/M Quick Response Teams in five (5) provinces of MIMAROPA to regularly monitor the situations in their areas. All members of R/P/C/M QRTs were on-call and on standby to be on duty, ready for deployment if needed. Advised P/MQRTs to coordinate with concerned LGUs to report any unusual eventualities in their respective areas and take appropriate actions. Information and Communication Technology Management Unit (ICTMU) of DSWD-FO MIMAROPA was activated to ensure robust communication system. Ensured that there was an on-call truck available for delivery of goods to areas that will be affected. Closed coordination with the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) for any warning signal updates for monitoring purposes and response mechanism for areas that will be affected. With ongoing purchase and replenishment of stockpile and prepositioned FFPs.

DSWD-FO VI

DSWD-FO VII

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
19 February 2018	Provision of NFI shall be based on the assessment results of the LGU's capacity.
15 February 2018	 Typhoon signals were already lifted in the Region so sea travels resumed; strandees reported were already able to sail to their destinations. Classes were still suspended in Cebu Province A few LGUs in Bohol were still flooded but flood waters were expected to subside since there had been little to no rains since in the morning. Major rivers in Bohol also did not overflow. Despite TS Basyang made a landfall in Dumaguete City on the night of 14 February 2018, there were no reported incidents in the nearby LGUs. Most of the reported IDPs were from the Northern part of Negros Oriental. There were no reported incidents in the flood-prone LGUs in Negros Oriental.
14 February 2018	 DSWD-FO VII was closely monitoring and coordinating with the affected LGUs through the SWADTs and MATs and on standby for assistance and augmentation support needed by the affected areas.
12 February 2018	 DSWD-FO VII Quick Response Team was on standby for any assistance and augmentation support needed from the field. All DSWD staff from the field were already updated/alerted of the latest weather information since Friday. They were also requested to monitor their areas of responsibility and provide information/updates for any incidents. Around 300 passengers were left stranded in Cebu ports in the morning, leaving at least 27 passenger vessels suspended in some ports according to the PCG-Cebu. Ports that have cancelled trips were in Pier 1 and Pier 3 at Cebu City port, Bantayan; Sta. Fe Santander; Samboan; Camotes Island; Mandaue City Warf; Dumanjug and Tabuelan, among others.
10 February 2018	 OCD 7 called for an Emergency Response Preparedness Meeting together with RDRRMC member agencies. Each agency reported their preparedness measures and activities for TS Basyang.

DSWD-FO VIII

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
16 February 2018	The DSWD-FO VIII has submitted their Terminal Report .
15 February 2018	 No more stranded passengers in ports. SWADTs were continuously in coordination and collaboration with P / C / MSWDOs and/or P / C / MDRRMOs to ensure timely information of affected families and status of displaced families for immediate provision of assistance and augmentation of relief goods whenever there's a request of augmentation coming from the LGUs. Staffs manning the warehouse were alerted to ensure the readiness of displacching the food and non-food commodities.
14 February 2018	• Assigned a DReAMU staff to render duty at the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) in the morning and for the succeeding days of operations.





	 DROMIC Focal was continuously monitoring weather condition and in close coordination with SWADTs for any incident reports on the ground; also in coordination with PDO rendering duty at the OCD for any additional updates necessary to capture.
13 February 2018	 QRT was activated. Assigned a DReAMU staff to render duty at the Office of Civil Defense (OCD). Predetermined the task force who would render duty at the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) and Operations Center (OPCEN) for the succeeding days of operations for TS "Basyang". SWADTs were advised to have prompt coordination and collaboration with P/C/MSWDOs and/or P/C/MDRRMOs to ensure timely information of affected and displaced families for immediate provision of assistance and augmentation of relief goods.
12 February 2018	 SWAD Teams, especially the Southern Leyte Team, were alerted and advised to closely coordinate LSWDOs and LDRRMOs, and immediately report any eventualities. All QRT members were alerted. DROMIC-FO VIII focal attended the Emergency Response Preparedness Meeting at the Office of Civil Defense on 11 February 2018. Personnel manning the warehouse are also alerted to ensure the readiness of dispatching the food and non-food items whenever needed.

DSWD-FO IX

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
12 February 2018	 The DSWD-FO IX was repacking goods to maintain the required 15,000 packs. The Field Office also prepositioned family food packs at its satellite offices. The DSWD-FO IX through its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) prepared and disseminated a memorandum on preparedness response to officially inform the SWADT Leaders to monitor the situation in their areas of responsibility. Also, the Field Office shared the initial update of DOST-PAGASA regarding TS Basyang. The DRMD Chief attended PDRA convened by the Office of Civil Defense.

DSWD-FO X

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
23 February 2018	 Based on the report of SWADT leaders in the provinces of Bukidnon, Lanao del Norte, Camiguin, Misamis Oriental, and Misamis Occidental, there were no reported damages and displacement of families caused by TS Basyang. DSWD-FO X submitted their Terminal Report.
13 February 2017	 The QRT was ready for activation any time and closely monitoring the weather condition. SWADT Leaders, in coordination with respective LDRRMCs in all provinces were prepared to respond to emergencies. Living along coastal areas and riverbanks were advised to evacuate to safer areas, especially those residents of TS Vinta-affected areas in Lanao del Norte, Bukidnon, and Cagayan de Oro City, for possible re-occurrence of high water level and flashfloods.

DSWD-FO CARAGA

DATE	ACTION(S) TAKEN
24 February 2018	 As per information from the MSWDO of Mainit, Surigao del Norte, the IDPs inside evacuation centers have not yet fully returned to their respective houses since the flood in their area has not completely subsided. Moreover, the IDPs would leave the evacuation centers by day since classrooms are being utilized during school days, and return to stay there by night. The SWADT, PAT, and C/MAT are continuously coordinating with respective P/C/MDRRMCs for the ongoing data generation and reporting. The DSWD-FO CARAGA's DReAMU is continuously monitoring the actual situation in the ground, in close coordination with the LSWDOs and LDRRMOs for the provision of timely and continuous updates.
15 February 2018	 All class suspensions throughout the region has been lifted since February 12, 2018. The respective P/C/MDRRMCs across the region were still activated.
14 February 2018	 There was an ongoing rescue operation in Cantilan, Surigao del Sur. Brgy. Calagdaan was experiencing low level of flood while the flood affecting other barangays has already subsided. DSWD-FO CARAGA was closely monitoring and coordinating with the affected LGUs through the SWADTs and MATs and on standby for assistance and augmentation support needed by the affected areas.
13 February 2018	 All sea trips in the region were still suspended by the Philippine Coast Guard. Data on stranded remained the same. Classes in all levels both in private and public schools were suspended in the Municipality of Sibagat, Agusan Del Sur; and in the Provinces of Agusan Del Norte and Surigao Del Sur. Province of Dinagat suspended classes only from pre-school to elementary level, while in Surigao Del Norte from pre-school to high school level. P/C/MDRRMCs across the region activated their respective Quick Response Teams in preparation for TS Basyang. Moreover, the SWADT, PAT and C/MAT were also coordinating strongly with them for data generation and reporting.
12 February 2018	 All QRT members were on standby for possible deployment. As per report from Philippine Coast Guard - Surigao Norte Station, sea travels from Surigao, Lipata and Dinagat Islands were already suspended as well as sea travels from and to Nasipit Port in Nasipit, Agusan del Norte are suspended since 11 February 2018 due to TS Basyang Per report from Lipata Ferry Terminal in Brgy. Lipata, Surigao City as of 8AM, 12 February 2018, 38 passengers are stranded going to Liloan and Benit, San Ricardo, Southern Leyte. Nine (9) rolling cargoes are also stranded in Lipata Port. DSWD-FO CARAGA through its Disaster Response Assistance and Management Unit would communicate with SWAD Teams, and Provincial/City/Municipal Action Teams to continue monitor the situation in close coordination with the LSWDOs and LDRRMOs and continuously provide updates.





The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD continues to closely coordinate with concerned DSWD-Field Offices for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
