Book Culture in XVIII Century New Spain	This bibliographic database enables the systematic study publications announcements in the pages of the <i>Gazeta de México</i> , the first periodic publication of New Spain. The database includes books, brochures and magazines, published mainly during the eighteenth and early nineteenth centuries in Mexico and other countries in Europe and America. These were advertised as news for commercial purposes. In total, 1,872 print ads were identified. In order to facilitate access, the system offers several search tools to meet diverse information needs. It includes the option of " advanced search " that allows to locate names, titles, themes and other specific data. " Explore " includes word-cloud with the terms that quantitatively represent the subject matter of the advertised publications. In " indexes " the user will find indexes to the names of the printers of these publications, places and years of printing, places of sale, names of authors, subjects and titles, to name a few. This system also allows locating spatially on a map the places where some of the printing houses were active in Mexico City during the 18th century .
