Learning Outcome	• We are learning to recognise 2D and 3D shapes. • We are learning to solve problems using repeated addition and times tables.

Prior knowledge 	Children have been working in their own classes at school learning about shapes and their features. They have also been doing some repeated addition. This lesson aims to bring that knowledge together.

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	Learn Actively engage in the Google Meet through commenting orally and in the chat. Think about what they already know about shapes. Discuss the maths to build knowledge.	Before lesson: -Create activity and Jamboard considering the range of learners and home learning environment. • Launch lesson- What do we know about shapes? • Get children identifying shapes. • Talk about 2 dimensions and 3 dimensions. What does it mean? • Collect student voices and ideas in Jamboard. • Share Kahoot to get children thinking and see what they still need to work on.
	Create Learners engage in creating in the Jamboard. Learners develop their knowledge and create using this in their activities.	Teacher is available for support via email or commenting on Google slides.

Reflection and Analysis

	Lesson Content - The children seemed to enjoy the topic. They are very engaged in maths online and really love sharing what they know. I found that some learners are quicker and it is harder to get them to hold back and give others thinking time. Using the chat helped with this. Lesson Pacing and Lesson Delivery - Having a variety of games, discussion, reading to and creating with the Jamboard meant that even though the lesson was about 30 mins in length the learners remained involved. Learner requested the kahoot and wanted more time together. Student Understanding- The children's understanding varied, however most showed some good understanding of 2D shapes, 3D shape knowledge is still growing. I was impressed with the repeated addition knowledge and hope this will over time translate to times table knowledge.
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
