Does the agency carry liability insurance and workers' compensation? Patients should be protected from any injuries, theft, & other caregiver-related issues.	YES			
Are Caregivers W2 employees? YES! 1099 (worker/contractors) cannot be actively directed by the agency. Agency can lose control of outcomes, and processes, and may not be properly insured.	W2			
Does the agency practice equality with Payor Types? Private Pay, Medi-Cal, VA, LTC, Workers Comp – this ensures all our community gets the care they deserve.	YES			
Does the agency provide 24/7 office support? Patients will always reach someone in the agency, on nights, weekends, and holidays.	YES			
Is there dedicated training time? Monthly, Quarterly, Yearly, Ad-Hoc to ensure consistent, professional, and empathetic care always for patients.	YES			
Do employees know SOC-341A, and signed it? We are legally mandated Reporters	YES			
Does the agency conduct supervisory visits to monitor caregiver performance? Conducting supervisory visits assures the agency, patient, and the patient's family members that services are being delivered at a high standard.	YES			
Does the agency have a support model in place to cover gaps in coverage in the event the caregiver is unable to work a shift? Quality agencies will have contingency plans in place to support the client and ensure all shifts are covered.	YES			
Does the agency provide specific training that covers important topics that can help prevent hospital admissions or readmissions? Caregivers should be able to identify early warning signs of possible health issues and bring them to the attention of the agency and families.	YES
