## Muscatine School Board of Education August 9, 2021

The Board of Education of the Muscatine Community School District, in the County of Muscatine, State of Iowa, met in regular session on Monday, August 9, 2021, at 7 p.m. at City Hall in Council Chambers. President Tammi Drawbaugh called the meeting to order. Directors Karen Cooney, John Dabeet, Aaron Finn, Toby McCarter, Mike Morgan, and Dennis Schuur were present. Also present were Superintendent Clint Christopher, Executive Director of Teaching and Learning Joelle McConnaha, and Director of Finance Tom Anderson and student school board representatives Dylan Metzger and Gabrielle Salazar.

Through a previously recorded video, the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Ms. Puck's 1st Grade Class from S.P.A.R.K.

Drew Westberg, 2602 Imperial Oaks Drive, <u>spoke</u> (3:30) about the Coronavirus and how much more transmissible and contagious the Delta variant is to those vaccinated and unvaccinated. He requested that the Board consider challenging the law passed in May by Governor Reynolds that prohibits schools from mandating masks in order to provide a safe learning environment for those who cannot receive the vaccine, especially students under 12 years of age.

Under Board Targets/Goals Report and board goal "Muscatine Schools will utilize resources effectively and equitably," Director of Operations Ryan Castle <u>updated</u> (9:41) the board on the facilities projects that are currently underway which includes the MHS stadium project, the MHS fine arts project, and the district-wide phone system installation.

Mr. Castle also discussed the upcoming projects for the 2021-22 school year which include the MHS auditorium, upgrades to the HVAC systems district-wide, and the centralized kitchen. He noted that the facility committee's first meeting reviewed the facilities study. It's next meeting will be scheduled soon of which the committee will begin to look at enrollment data and long-range usage needs in order to plan and prioritize as the district moves forward. The committee will also discuss Central Middle School

Under Board Targets/Goals Report and board goal "Students will learn in a positive and supportive environment," Superintendent Christopher shared (20:33) information regarding the strategic planning session held on July 28, 2021. He reviewed the Desired Daily Experiences document which are statements that the district hopes each student, parent, and staff member feels every day. These statements will drive the district's actions and will focus and align with the district's core values. This document will be shared with all stakeholders to get their feedback. Feedback will then be collected, shared with the board, and used to make revisions. The district will then ask the board to adopt the finalized document.

Superintendent Christopher <u>reviewed</u> (29:03) this year's protocols and procedures for starting school. He noted that the district cannot mandate masks but will highly recommend their use especially for those who cannot be vaccinated. Vaccinations are not required but encouraged to those who are able to receive them. The district will work closely with Muscatine County Public Health and the Iowa Department of Public Health. He stressed that if students or staff are sick, they need to stay home until

they are free of a fever for 24 hours and not symptomatic. Communication will be sent out to staff and parents regarding this year's Return to Learn Plan in the near future.

Superintendent Christopher <u>shared</u> (32:57) that the district is offering a virtual option, Edgenuity. If parents choose this option, the district asks for a one semester commitment. This virtual option is different than last year's online learning model. The program uses Edgenuity teachers not Muscatine teachers, however, staff will stay connected with students to monitor progress and reach out to families for extra support. Students will be assigned a mentor, typically counselors, to monitor progress. There is no cost to parents.

A motion was made by Director Dabeet and seconded by Director Cooney to approve the Memorandum of Understanding between Muscatine Community School District and Shared Vision Partners: Public Health, ISU Extension County Office (Louisa and Muscatine Counties), Muscatine Community Y, and Lutheran Services in Iowa. All ayes; motion carried.

Superintendent Christopher <u>discussed</u> (44:19) the need for a centralized kitchen that will allow the transition out of Central Middle School and into another location that will serve the district's elementary buildings. Food Service Supervisor Alisha Eggers <u>shared</u> (45:36) that over the last school year 332,000 meals were prepared and served out of Central's kitchen and that a centralized kitchen would help increase food quality and safety and the ability to create more items from scratch.

A motion was made by Director Schuur and seconded by Director Dabeet to approve the contract with Legat Architects for Professional Architect Services for the Muscatine High School Centralized Kitchen Addition and Renovations Project. All ayes; motion carried.

Superintendent Christopher <u>shared</u> (58:27) that the district will be using ESSER dollars to update the HVAC systems throughout the district as it is the highest priority for the district to update air quality and air flow. Director of Operations Ryan Castle <u>mentioned</u> (59:07) that one of his biggest concerns is that most school districts across the United States will be doing something similar and thus, the sooner Muscatine Schools can get started, the better, in order to get the HVAC systems ordered and delivered.

A motion was made by Director Finn and seconded by Director McCarter to approve the Contract with Legat Architects for Professional Architect Services for the 2022 HVAC Improvements Project. All ayes; motion carried.

Director of Finance Tom Anderson presented (1:01:26) the June 2021 Financials.

As part of Board Development, President Drawbaugh <u>shared</u> (1:08:29) information on the upcoming election and noted that key election information is available from the Iowa Association of School Board's website as well as the Muscatine Community School District's website. Board members then also discussed the handout regarding how to ask relevant questions when presented with progress reports and how the board should gear their questions towards the lens of governance vs. management.
