- You are to write 10 sentences.
- Each sentence must contain a vocabulary word from Unit 6 and the grammatical elements listed on this page.
- Subject Matter: Choose an overall subject matter based on something you studied in school this month. Sentences should relate to each other in terms of subject matter.

The Sentences (in Order):

- 1. A sentence in pattern A-3.
- 2. A sentence in pattern A-5.
- 3. A sentence in pattern B-2.
- 4. A periodic sentence in pattern B-3.
- 5. A sentence containing C-1, C-2, or C-3.
- 6. A sentence beginning with a subject, then an essential appositive, and then a complete predicate. Ex: *My sister Anne* is a personal chef and caterer.
- 7. A sentence containing pattern C-4, C-5, or C-6.
- 8. A sentence containing pattern D-2. Use an action verb in the infinitive phrase.
- 9. A sentence containing pattern E-1 or E-2.
- 10. A sentence containing a noun clause.

Format Requirements:

- Type the sentences in the order listed above.
- Format: 12-pt., Times New Roman, double spaced, 1" margins with an MLA Header (Your name, teacher, class, due date) and title
- Highlight, underline, or make bold the vocabulary word.
- Use a different vocabulary word each time.
- Sentences must use the vocabulary word and grammatical elements correctly, including punctuation.
- Avoid additional editing errors (spelling, punctuation, capitalization, usage).
- Use the vocabulary word in context to show you understand its meaning (NOT "To be adroit is good," for instance). If you need to add a suffix to change the part of speech, that's fine (such as "The racecar driver adroitly maneuvered around the sudden crash").
- Do not copy even a phrase from another source; do your own work. This includes my examples from the patterns packet, such as "To be..." or "At the [movie's] end..." or "At the [end/beginning] of the..."
- Submit to Google Classroom for free grading (see below) and also as a final draft.

Errors with These Requirements: No credit for that sentence.

Point Value: 20 points per unit
