Instead of blaming faulty brain chemistry for depression, Hari examines nine disconnection points in modern life that influence our social-emotional well-being. He also highlights the protective factors that buoy us: connections with community, purpose, healthy values, meaningful work, nature, a hopeful vision for the future and many more. If you are interested in talking about this topic or just want to chat, come join me for a walk & talk on Thursday, September 19 at 4 pm. This will be really informal and accessible to those with mobility issues as we will stick to the bike path and sidewalks in Hinesburg--probably only 30-45 minutes. It would be great to get students, parents, community members and staff alike. I'm going rain or shine, so dress appropriately if you want in! Finally, thank you to BringChange2Mind for helping our school recognize that we don't have to passively accept labels and ill health. We can make a difference in our lives and the lives of others if we are willing to be authentic and open to a new way of thinking about mental health.
