

BCAM: Aspiring Head Coaches Academy

BCAM is committed to the professional development of our members. To expand our mission - to represent and serve basketball coaches for the betterment of our great game - BCAM is offering its 3rd Annual **Aspiring Head Coaches Academy**. The purpose is to prepare potential head coaches with increased knowledge, experienced networks, and wider opportunities to aid in the preparation of becoming a high school head varsity basketball coach.

The program is designed not only for those who simply desire to be a head coach but, more so, for those currently on a path to do so. We ask for the minimum requirements/experiences for the application to be the following:

- BCAM Member
- Currently on a high school staff as a head freshman coach, junior varsity coach, varsity assistant, OR college basketball experience as a player, grad assistant, manager, etc.

Note: If you do not fit one of these requirements but still feel this program applies to you, please indicate your unique qualifications in your application cover letter.

Attendees will experience a variety of presentations from veteran leaders, coaches, and administrators to better prepare to obtain and, most importantly, oversee a varsity basketball program. The program will consist of three 90-minute Zoom sessions and a 3-hour leadership session in person at Clawson High School. (See dates below)

- Session #3 Saturday, May 11th Location: Clawson High School 9 am-12 pm

Participants will be expected to create or refine their mission and coaching philosophy and will be provided actionable feedback from seasoned educators during our in-person session. Beyond the coaching networks from the program, coaches will also receive a mentor who will guide them before, during, and after - available coaching opportunities. After the program, coaches will receive a BCAM certificate of completion verifying the experience.
