## **Block Registration**

 All CHASS transfer students will register for a transfer learning community block (CHFY 010 Course) before they can register for other courses their first quarter at UCR.

# **About the Transfer Learning Community (TLC)**

All CHASS transfer students will take the Transfer Learning Community (TLC) their first quarter at UCR. The Transfer Learning Community consists of the CHFY 010 Step-By-Step to College Success Course which is a 2-unit Satisfactory/No Credit Course (S/NC) online course, with support from Transfer Ambassadors. CHASS transfer students can then choose to continue to partner with the CHASS Transfers F1RST Program the rest of their first year at UCR through the Transfer Year Experience (TYE).

## CHFY 010 Step-By-Step to College Success Course

- 2-units, 50 minutes/week
- Offered in Three Modalities: Synchronous, Asynchronous and In-Person
- Led by two Transfer Ambassadors
- ALL CHASS Transfer Students will take this TLC course their first guarter at UCR

- Peer Mentorship from Transfer Ambassadors
- Campus Resource Highlights
- Readings About Success from the book "Be Great! Your Journey is Your Legacy"
- Established Transfer Community

# **About the Transfer Year Experience (TYE)**

CHASS transfer students can choose to continue to partner with the CHASS Transfers F1RST Program throughout the rest of their first year at UCR by submitting an application for the Transfer Year Experience (TYE) on our website. The TYE Canvas course will open in Fall 2025.


## The 2025-2026 TYE Application will be available in Fall 2025.

#### The TYE will consist of:

- Peer Support One-on-one Appointments with Transfer Ambassadors
- Community Building Activities Socials, Mixers, Study Sessions, Networking, Celebrations, etc.
- Professional Development Workshops Letter of Recommendations, Grad School, Internships, etc.
- Personal Development Workshops Time Management, Academic Self-Help, Financial Aid, Self-Care etc.

# CHASS transfer students will receive a Certificate of Completion at the end of the academic year if they successfully complete the following:

- 1. CHFY 010 (Transfer Learning Community) or UCR Honors LC Course
- 2. A minimum of 1 CHASS F1RST Event
- 3. A minimum of 1 UCR Campus Event
- 4. Connect with at least 1 UCR campus resource during the academic year
- 5. A minimum of 2 one-on-one meetings with a Transfer Ambassador
- 6. Meet with your academic or peer advisor at least once in the academic year
- 7. Meet with a professor or teaching assistant at least once during the academic year and
- 8. Complete End of Program Survey



All first-year transfer students in CHASS are required to participate in the TLC All first-year transfer students in CHASS have the option to continue to partner through the TYE

# **Block Registration**

The Transfer Learning Community (TLC) supports CHASS first-year transfer students by providing the tools and resources needed to succeed at UCR and beyond! You will register for your TLC block during your Advising Session, and you'll be prompted to do so before registering for other courses. You may be able to change your block once or twice if needed. Complete the following steps to register for your block:

Step 1- Go to the "Registration" Portal on your R'Web

Step 2- Click "Register for Classes"

Step 3- Click on the "Blocks" tab

Step 4- Select a Transfer Learning Community block by clicking the bubble

Step 5- Save your chosen Transfer Learning Community block by clicking "Submit"

Step 6- Proceed to searching for other courses to register for

- Go to Office Hours- even if it is just to say hello
- Attend and be Present for Class
- Read the Syllabus
- Take Notes (e.g... Cornell Method, Mind Mapping)
- Take Time to Study- 2 Hours of Study Time for Every 1 Hour of Class
- Self Care- Take a Break Studying as Needed to Avoid Burnout!
- Form a Study Group
- Ask for Help- there is no stupid or dumb question!
- Use Time Management Methods and Techniques (e,g... Planners, Canvas Calendar, Google Calendar, Pomodoro Method, Eisenhower Method)
