How do I sign up to take the SAT or ACT?

Which colleges accept the SAT and which ones accept the ACT?

All colleges that are part of the University System of Georgia, most out-of-state colleges and private colleges accept scores from either test. However, check with your colleges regarding the usage of SAT/ACT test scores to be sure.

How do I get my score report to colleges/scholarship agencies/NCAA Clearinghouse?

When you register for the SAT or ACT, you may select up to 4 schools or agencies to receive a report. Students may have all scores sent or select which test date to have sent to schools/agencies.

When and how many times should I plan to take the SAT and/or ACT?

- Based on research done by the College Board, they recommend taking the test two to three times.
- It is a good idea to take these tests about half way through or at the end of Algebra II.
- We recommend that students take the SAT or ACT during the spring semester of their junior year.
- If you are applying early action or decision anywhere, you should shoot for achieving your best score(s) by the June test date of your junior year.

How can I prepare for the SAT/ACT's?

- The best preparation is to study hard and take the most rigorous courses you can handle while in high school and to read broadly and often.

What is the SAT Subject Test?

- Tests designed to measure knowledge and ability to apply that knowledge to a specific subject
- Colleges use this for admissions, course placements, or both

What is the TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language)?

- An alternative test for students who have been speaking English for less than 5 years
- Used to evaluate English proficiency
