Chronic lung diseases limited to the following:

Bronchiectasis

COPD (chronic obstructive pulmonary disease)

Interstitial lung disease

Pulmonary embolism

Pulmonary hypertension

Chronic liver diseases limited to the following:

Cirrhosis

Nonalcoholic fatty liver disease

Alcoholic liver disease

Autoimmune hepatitis

Cystic fibrosis

Diabetes mellitus, type 1

Diabetes mellitus, type 2*

Gestational diabetes

Disabilities‡, including Down's syndrome

Heart conditions (such as heart failure, coronary artery disease, or cardiomyopathies)

HIV (human immunodeficiency virus)

Mental health conditions limited to the following:

Mood disorders, including depression

Schizophrenia spectrum disorders

Neurologic conditions limited to dementia‡ and Parkinson's disease

Obesity (BMI ≥ 30 or ≥ 95 th percentile in children)

Physical inactivity

Pregnancy and recent pregnancy

Primary immunodeficiencies

Smoking, current and former

Solid-organ or blood stem-cell transplantation

Tuberculosis

Use of corticosteroids or other immunosuppressive medications
