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## **WPP Instructions and Information :)**

### **How do I turn in a WPP?**

1. "New Post" on your blog
  - a. labeled with "WPP"
  - b. titled appropriately - "WPP # \_\_: Unit \_\_ Concept \_\_"
  - c. Copy EMBED code from MentorMob playlist (click on "share" to get EMBED code, it always starts with <iframe>
  - d. On your "new post", click on "HTML" tab instead of "COMPOSE" and paste the EMBED code there.
  - e. Click back to "COMPOSE" tab to see the green bordered MentorMob playlist
  - f. Publish Post
  - g. Click to view your post on your blog so you can get the URL
2. Submit Blog Post URL on GoogleForm found on class blog page (turquoise box) for that specific unit.
  - a. WPP 1- turn in [here](#)
  - b. WPP2- turn in [here](#)
  - c. WPP1/2 - get your original word problems from the summer [here](#)

### **How do I grade a WPP?**

- Login to your MentorMob account (must create new if you don't have one).  
mentormob.com/splash. Just sign up with your google account that you used to make your blog.

- “Create” new playlist
  - See example below for *Title*, *Description*, *Type*, *Category*, and *Tags*.
    - Put your First Name and Last Initial Only first in the title.
    - Please notice the WPP #, the Unit and Concept, and how I said “Linear Models” in the description because that is the title of Unit A Concept 6. This will change based on the concept!

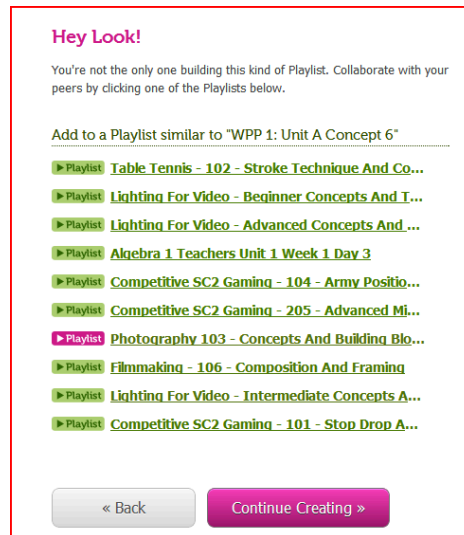

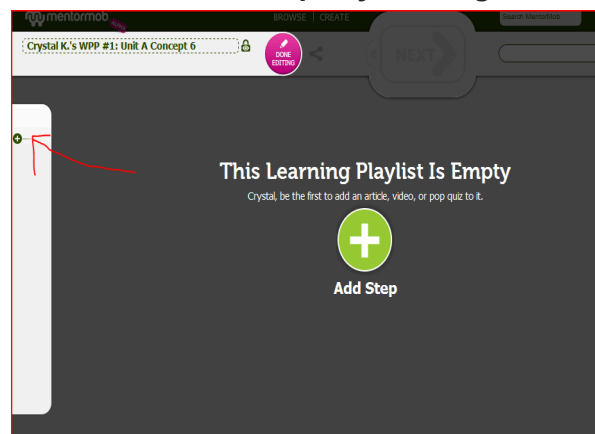

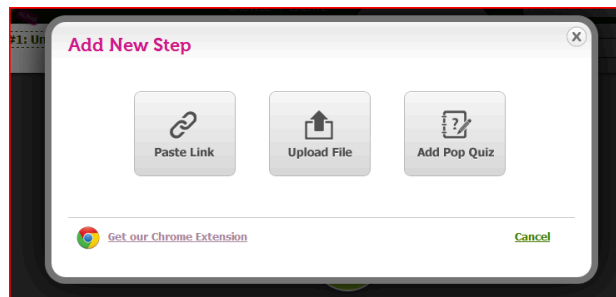
- Click *Continue* when done.
- You will probably see something like this. Don't worry about it and click “continue creating”



- At this point, you should be able to “add step” by clicking on the + sign on the left side.



- You can choose between:



- Paste Link - anytime you want to link to an online image, a video link, etc
- Upload File - anytime you want to upload a word doc, pdf, or picture file
- Write an article - anytime you just want to add text

## Three steps to an amazing WPP!

**1. “Title Page” step** (find an image online, draw a picture, or record a quick clip of something that corresponds to the story problem). You will either “paste link” if the file is online, or “upload file” if the file is .doc/.pdf/.jpg on your computer.

- Title this step: **"Introduction: \_\_\_\_\_"** (in the blank put the title of your WPP... be creative!)
- Description: State which Unit and Concept this WPP is for. Include the description of the concept.
  - Example: Unit A Concept 6: Writing and Solving Linear Models

**2. "Explanation of the problem" step** (do this by choosing "write an article" as the playlist step and just typing it directly on MentorMob)

- Title this step: **"The problem: \_\_\_\_\_"** (in the blank put the title of your WPP... be creative!)
- For the Description, type the following: "Read the word problem and answer the questions. Show all work and steps clearly"

**3. "Picture explanation of the solution" step** (work out the problem yourself clearly and step by step and then take a picture of your work. You can take multiple pictures if needed). The picture can just be uploaded straight from your computer to the playlist using the "Upload File" option.

- Title this step: **"The solution: \_\_\_\_\_"** (in the blank put the title of your WPP... be creative!)
- For the Description, type the following: "This picture will go over the solution to this word problem. Make sure to try it on your own first before viewing the picture in detail."

**IDEAL:**

- 1. “Title Page” step** (find an image online, draw a picture, or record a quick clip of something that corresponds to the story problem)
- 2. “Explanation of the problem” step** (options: (1) type up the details of the problem on a word document and upload (2) record yourself reading the details of the problem, possibly acting out key parts (3) Both!)
- 3. “Choose your answer” step** (make a quiz on the playlist including 3-4 plausible answer choices. )
- 4. “Add your solution” step** (create a public, editable Google Doc for classmates to click on and add their videos or images of their solutions.
- 5. “Video explanation of the solution” step** (work out the problem yourself. This step is not added until assigned, but should be completed at the beginning)
- 6. Self Grading.** Student scores him/herself using the rubric after receiving at least 4 student responses to his/her playlist. With rubric, student submits work page including correct answer and work with explanation for other “wrong” answers they included in their quiz.
